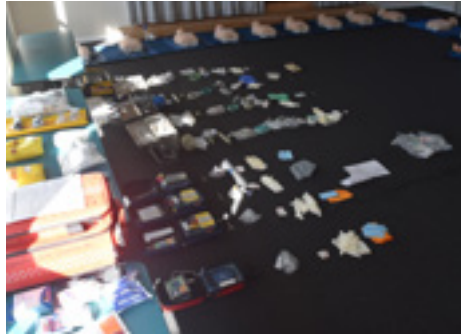

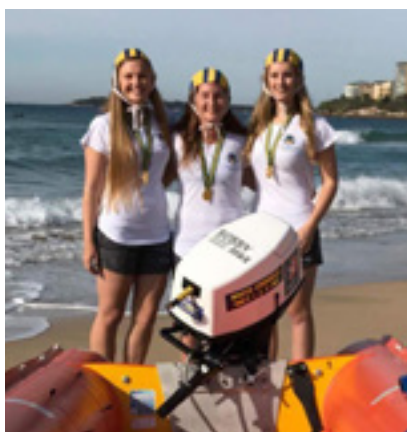

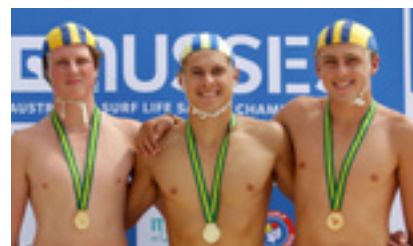

Brian has been actively involved with the community through his lifelong dedication to the sports of Sprint Canoe and Surf Life Saving.

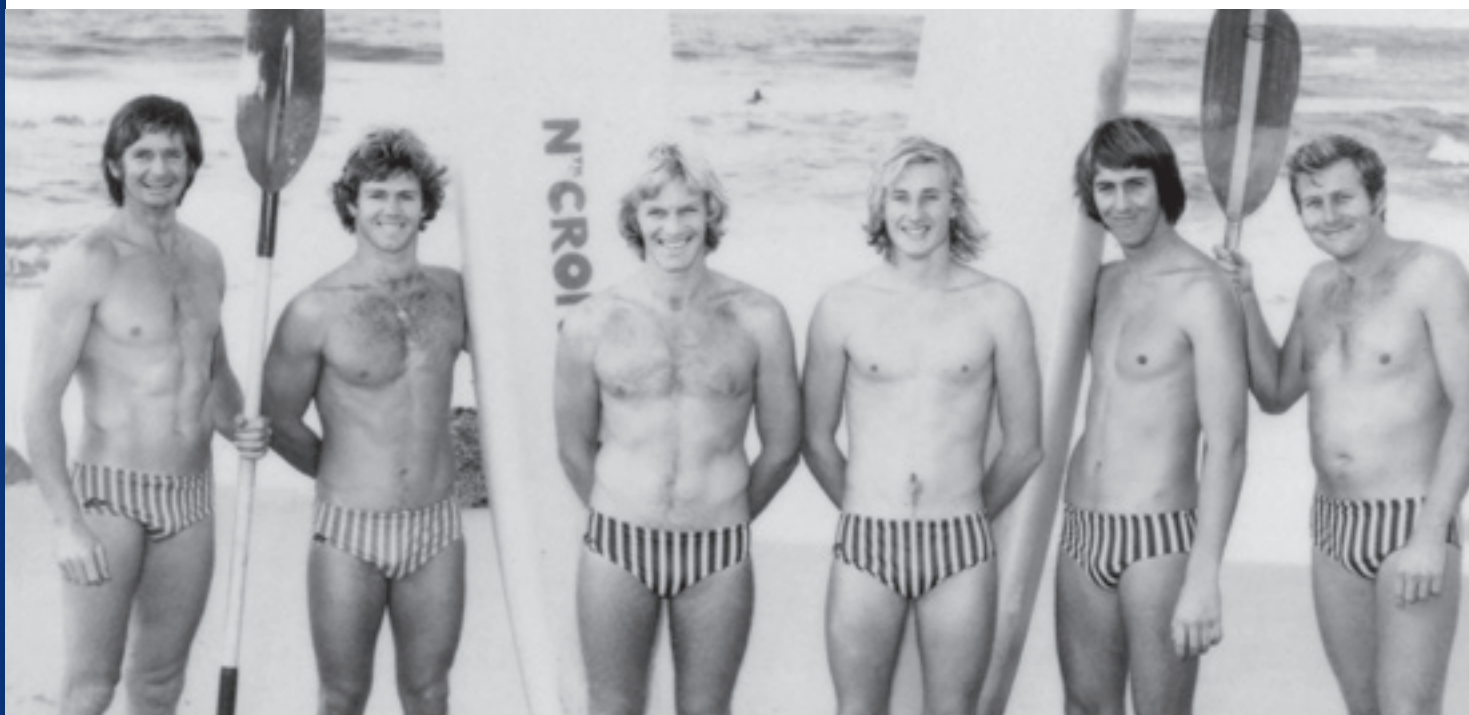
Brian began his community service as a Surf Life saver with Maroubra SLSC at age 17 in 1959. He was awarded the Merit of Surf Bravery Rescue (Lurline Bay). His sense of duty has grown from saving one life to making a vast contribution and impact to many people involved both surf lifesaving and sprint canoe, primarily as a coach, but also as a manager and mentor.

As a young adult, his athletic talents were confirmed with four Australian Surf Life Saving Championship medals and two NSW medals. The emergence of his real talent was his gift for coaching and team management. He demonstrated this talent early, coaching a beginner paddler to Olympic level. Brian was an Australian Olympic team coach at four Olympics. In addition, Brian has made time over many years for his surf lifesaving

passion volunteering as Head Coach and Surf Boat Coach for North Cronulla SLSC together with many other roles at the club, State and National level.

Everything Brian does involves excellence, he makes things happen, he is a motivator and contributor, with valuable sport and life knowledge and skills that he shares freely.

The financial statements show a profit of \$41,033 for the year (2016 \$33,607).

Our 2017 result shows very similar trading conditions with no major variances year on year. The financial focus for our surfclub should always be on cashflow.

Cash generated from operating activities during this financial year of \$121,239 (2016 \$126,717) was invested in capital equipment for lifesaving, clubhouse assets and competition to value of \$126,178, resulting in an increase in cash held of \$11,879.

COMMUNICATION REPORT

The 2016-2017 Season saw the introduction of Marketing and Communications Director as a position on the Surf Club Board.

Over the course of the past few seasons the role of communicating to the members and the general public has largely been undertaken by the Secretary. Whilst it is still primarily the responsibility of the Secretary to manage correspondence it became apparent that the work load required in this one position needed to be shared. Hence the introduction of the position.

The main scope of the position in the initial season has been to work closely with the entire Board but in particular the Secretary to manage the content of the website, social media and liaise with the media. In addition, due to the circumstances that have been experienced in the club office this year the production of the Annual Report has also been incorporated into this role.

SLS at all levels now has policies regarding communication and social media which includes guidelines for clubs and its members. A large part of the role over the past season is to monitor content at all levels of the organisation to ensure members are both informed and recognised.

The events of Aussies 2017 were a perfect example of the need for a designated communication officers with events postponed, then cancelled in many cases it was important to ensure that members were well informed and importantly supported during this period.

Over the past season North Cronulla have attempted to again keep our members well informed via a variety of mediums. This can be a delicate balance at times as it is important not to overload volunteers and also remember that most if not all members now receive instant messages from so many different sources such as other sporting and recreational groups, dentist and doctor reminders and messages from schools, clubs and the list continues.

The main platforms for communication, promotion and recognition utilised over the past twelve months include but are not limited to:

- **Club website** – easily accessible, no pass words required the website contains information relevant to the entire club including everything from patrols rosters and teams, function and event information, nippers news, key dates, competition and education information and news. Like all websites the key to the success is keeping the information current and up to date. Data entry is extremely time consuming and as such recognition needs to be made to the Club Deputy President Craig McKinnery who has been responsible for this task.

Our Nippers produce a similar newsletter during the season. Copies of the newsletters are also uploaded onto the website.
- **Facebook** – still recognised as the most widely used form of social media our following over the past season hit the 1000 followers mark.
- **Instagram** – as with Facebook, Instagram provides another medium for promotion and recognition. Another platform with over 1000 followers.
- **Twitter** – whilst Twitter is the least used form of social media engagement based on follower numbers Twitter provides perhaps the best form of sponsor recognition.

It has been rewarding over the past season to be the first person in the club to undertake this new position. This is a position that would be well suited to any member who would like to volunteer their time, who has a good knowledge of websites and social media. Further more the position can be easily carried out by someone from home. As this position on the Board does not require the pre-requisite of a Bronze Medallion it is accessible to most members and as such I would encourage members to consider applying for the role in the future.

LIFESAVING DIRECTORS REPORT

“NO LIVES LOST”

Life Saving is our core responsibility and purpose and something we should never forget.

Some highlights of the season 2016-2017 season include:

- 76 Members achieved 100% Patrol Attendance
- 10 Members performed over 100 hours patrol hours – Alan Freeman 156.5, Jarrod Tranter 129, Monika Di Maio 122.25, Tim Thomas 113.5, Bill Brander 112.75, Gladys Honer 111.75, Brendan Lynch 106.75, Mark Anders 105.75, Melissa Thomas 104 and Madeline McDonald 100.5.
- 10 808 Patrol Hours, 82 Rescues, 2020 Preventative actions.
- Melissa Thomas, Tim Thomas and Peter Loomes achieved 10 Years 100% Patrol attendance.
- Patrol members Tina Hilleard (11), Martin Fulton, Linda Hawkins (12) and Kane Hughes (13) have all achieved over 10 years 100% attendance.
- Education Team lead by Mark Anders continued to produce a high quality of not only new Lifesavers achieving their SRC and Bronze Medallion but also members achieving advanced skills awards which are essential if we are to continue our fulfill our patrol obligations.
- 14 Patrol Team an increase from 12 in season 15-16 leading to a reduction of Patrol Hours for all members allocated to regular patrol teams
- Our experienced members who continue to devote countless hours to patrol and keep our beach safe as “volunteers” meaning they have no competition obligations to fulfill they just devote their time. These members will be completing their patrol service in the next few years – they need someone to replace them!
- Patrol Captains covering 14 Patrol Teams including new Patrol Captains Jarrod Tranter, Nick Kirby and Bronte Howell.
- Bronte Howell and Brendan Lynch were recognised as outstanding Senior Patrol member and Dave Cotter Junior Lifesaver.
- Club President Geoff Budd, Deputy President Craig McKinnery, Club Captain Jamie Primmer and Youth Development Director Monika Di Maio all achieved 100% Patrol attendance.
- Our Surf Sport Competitors were required to travel to country participating in carnivals and as a part of representing Branch, NSW and Australia. Special mention to each and every competitor who fall into this category for achieving 100% Patrol attendance. An amazing achievement given the commitment to travel, school, university, work, training and competition.
- IRB Team again successfully completed a 12-month program of patrols, water safety, education and training, surf sport carnival commitments and competition.

During 2016-2017 Season Surf Life Saving Australia implemented significant changes to their policy pertaining to



patrol hours and competition. Whilst considerable discussion and reference has been had regarding these changes within our club it was rewarding to see all active Patrol Members continued with their main purpose of joining a surf life saving club which is saving lives.

Unfortunately, again the position of Lifesaving Director received no nominations at the AGM for the 2016-2017 season.

Club Captain Jamie Primmer assumed the majority of the responsibilities in addition to his Club Captain duties which in turn made for a significant work load. Appreciation is extended to Gavan Duffy who has been in the role of Life Saving Director for the past season and later part of season of 2014-2015, the longest serving Life Saving Director in the past 5 years. Gavan indicated in advance that he was unable to continue as Life Saving Director this season however generously prepared the patrol roster for the season and arranged for a majority of the Patrol Captains and their teams to be placed prior to the start of season.

Over the past 5 seasons the position of Lifesaving Director has been held by four different people with only one person assuming the role for than a 12-month period. The role of Life Saving Director has been largely vacant for a majority of this time and fellow Board Members such as Tracey McKinnier, Kane Hughes, Monika Di Maio, Jamie Primmer and Craig McKinnier together with office staff such as Sheridan Hughes, Glenn-Marie Stockwell and Melissa Thomas performing many of the responsibilities required to ensure we as club meet our Life Saving requirements.

It is essential that we have an active Life Saving Team lead by a Life Saving Director. North Cronulla are extremely fortunate



to have an experienced base of Patrol Captains and Senior Life Saving Members. Careful observation of the Life Saving Awards, Education Awards, Patrol Awards together with of years of service tends to indicate that unless there is major intervention over the coming season (s) there will be issues in meeting patrol requirements especially if policy changes as referenced by SLSA are adopted. In addition, members and more importantly parents who support our young life savers must assume ownership for the importance of Life Saving and role we play in keeping our beach safe for the community.

Our surf club has over the past few seasons implemented changes to both the patrol attendance and demands and expectations being placed on our volunteers. The rules pertaining to make ups when members find a patrol substitute were changed to reflect the current demands society places on our Youth with working hours, study and competition. In addition, over for past few seasons membership criteria now recognises the importance parents play in supporting their children within the club in ensuring they perform their patrol responsibilities. Whilst more work needs to be done in this area it needs to be a joint effort with all key stakeholders engaged and working together to ensure Life Saving is moved into the next decade with dedicated and committed Life Savers.

PROJECT PHOENIX

REDEVELOPMENT OF EXISTING CLUB GEAR COMPLEX, CLUB AND COUNCIL FACILITIES AND CAFÉ

Project Phoenix is the demolition of the existing gear complex, café area, council amenities and lifeguard rooms and equipment store area and replace with a new two storey building with surf club gear complex, cafes, council amenities, lifeguard operational space and a first-floor commercial space with function, restaurant and bar spaces.

The existing Nipper room and ground floor amenities will be replaced with a new Nipper room, ground floor amenities plus new caretaker room. A new pool pump room will be built and modifications and upgrades to the existing pool decking and pool gates will occur.

Upgrade works will be completed on the existing heritage SLSC building to bring them up to compliance for fire, BCA and access with new male, female and disable access toilets, female locker and change room, stairs, foyers and a lift that will link the existing surf club to the new building.

The club has met with Sutherland Shire Council and their staff and our local councilors on numerous occasions and we

have made great progress over the last 12 months to review and address issues and items as part of the design process. The council has voted to support the surf club development application and will cover the cost of the DA fees and on behalf of our members we extend our gratitude and thanks for the continued council support on this project.

Our expenditure this season on Project Phoenix was \$70,970, and this amount will be offset by the second payment of \$60,000 from our Community Development Grant for the North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club – Upgrade of facilities project (Project Phoenix). The expenditure is reported in the 2016 to 2017 financial statements contained in the annual report.

Once again, the Club would like to extend our thanks and gratitude to the companies we have engaged and are supporting the club of this very important project:

At the time of writing this report, the documentation for the submission of a development application was being finalised and will be submitted by Sutherland Shire Council as owners of the buildings. Once submitted, the application will be reviewed by the NSW Government Joint Regional Planning Panel for a determination.

The development application approval is a major milestone that is an essential requirement for any future applications for any funding grants from our local, state and federal government

agencies. Our focus this season has been on achieving this milestone of DA approval and our attention will turn to the next stages of the project especially confirming our funding options and models to achieve the outcomes of the project.

North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club has a long and proud history of over 90 years of providing volunteer lifesaving services and patrols that protect the community. When completed, Project Phoenix will provide an operational and commercial platform that will enable the club and its members to continue providing these key and vital community based volunteer services for the next 100 years.

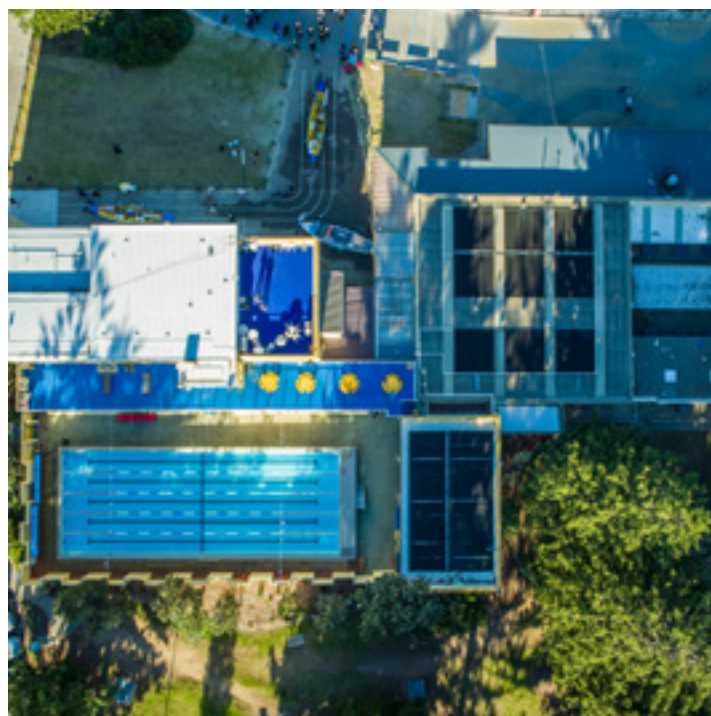

COMPETITION DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Well what a season in the competitive areas we all just experienced. It was certainly full of it's ups & downs, highs & lows. From the well attended early or pre-season trainings (with so much hope & expectation ahead), to the weather ravaged & sadly truncated Australian Championships. Throughout this 8 month season (and 12 for many) the Club competed in & fielded teams (all important) in a multitude of events : Boat relays, Lifesaver relays, Taplin relays, Board & Ski relays, Surf teams, Beach relay teams, R&R teams, IRB teams, March past teams. This is a great effort & a testament to the diversity, broadness & commitment of our competitors.

These teams competed strongly & represented the Club well in various events & carnivals, including :

Summer of Surf series, ASRL Boat series, NSW & Australian IRB championships, Sydney Water series, Interclub, Interbranch, Branch, State & Australian titles/Championships. To compete in these events & achieve the results each section did, would not be possible without the strong base & 'behind the scenes' structure that exists at the Club. To our Patrolling members, Parents, Coaches, Managers, Administrators, Associates, Section Leaders, Sponsors & supporters; they have all played their vital parts in this Club & it's teams to perform & do what they do. **Thank You to ALL.**

This enabled the Club to post very pleasing results in the major carnivals :

- 2nd at Branch (not far from first & miles ahead of 3rd). That is with 19 teams events taken out – where we were quite strong. (18 Gold; 22 Silver; 15 Bronze).
- 4th at State Championships. (6 Gold; 7 Silver; 9 Bronze).
- 6th at Australian Championships (2nd Club in NSW & 1st in Sydney Branch). (5 Gold; 4 Silver; 0 Bronze).

These results highlight the many, many outstanding efforts & performances, of both teams & individuals across all competitive sections of the Club. The specific & detailed results of above are highlighted in different sections of this Annual Report & are a joy to read through. What is as equally pleasing as these results, is the clearly evident camaraderie, mateship & culture that has built to this point we are at now. Being able to witness these intangibles, just gives both the Club & it's competitors more strength & enjoyment from what they do; and there time together.

As stated above the season had it's high & low points. Obviously the results & medals of teams & individuals at the various carnivals are high points; along with members & teams selected to representative squads from the Club. These included :

7 members of the IRB section selected to the Interstate team; 7 members from the Chargers section being selected to the Interbranch team (as well as having the Team Captain); 2 members of the Chargers being selected to the NSW team for the Interstate series; 4 crews from the Boat section being selected for the Interstate series (3 for NSW & 1 for Tasmania; AND to top that – our 23 male crew selected to represent Australia in the Trans-Tasman series.

Unfortunately there were a few lower points & they revolved around the 2 major carnivals for the year. The State championships due to surf conditions & East Coast lows were quite haphazard, unorganised or constantly changed & communicated poorly. Events were on then off, changed at 'the drop of a hat' and no real back-up plan in place. This resulted in Boats being in a lake to compete, then back to some large sets later & quite a deal of carnage; one male water area set aside barely used; and the 17 age group essentially having their whole program deferred to the Sunday (apart from a few events).

If this was a shame & at mercy of mother nature, well little did we know, there was more to come. We get to the Australian titles (the Grand Final of our sport), and after being brought forward a week into late March, 'Mother Nature' had a lot more to say! If State was a 'left hook', the Aussies was the 'knockout punch'. Of the Open Championships, 1 day of water events were held on the Wednesday. They knew it was coming & attempted to bring forward some events, which they did in some areas. Still about 25-33% got done in the water. Even less for Boats. I feel a lot of sympathy for many competitors who put in so much training, effort & dedication, who would have had their expectations to end like that. A grand final called off after a quarter. Still this led to some highlights as many more people than normal got to go down & watch & participate in the Beach events – watching, cheering, getting into the full swing. Providing an amazing atmosphere for 'blue & gold' competitors.

This led to probably the highlight individual performance of the year. All results are listed elsewhere in this report (as stated), but to see history made – a young girl not yet 16, a first year 17; not only win the 17 Female Flags event against an arch-rival; BUT to back up soon after and win the Open Female Flags. Amazing. Sensational. Alex Rampoldi – take a bow, 2 in fact !!

Another highlight for the season & a great way to close off the competitive season was the historic & time-honoured 'Interclub carnival'. While a local '4-way' it is so much more than that & fiercely competed over the many years, as anyone with Interclub experience will tell you. Quite a few rank this event

2nd to “The Aussies’ in how they see things of importance. So it is extremely gratifying to state that the “Mighty Blue & Gold” won ALL 5 shields on offer at this event. Therefore easily winning the ‘Interclub’ event & the Bill Marshall trophy. Well done to all involved in that event to ‘clean sweep the event for North Cronulla.

The Boat section, led by the ‘Admiral of the Fleet’ and previous Norm Rees winner Michael Bofinger. Strongly backed & supported by his sweeps & their crews (Dave, Mick.H, Mark.M, Bluey, Joel, as well as Yappy – ‘Tiger of the Pacific’; & Purds – “Cub of the Pacific”). With over 20+ crews, both male & female (the biggest around, I am told) - what a year they had. Competitively winning was a habit for these crews. Supplied representative crews as listed above. 2nd & 4th in the Boat relay at Aussies. It is not just that with this section, but also the work ethic when Bof sends the signal out, helping with set-ups, Club carnivals, logistics, anything. Their camaraderie, their culture, the attitude & friendships they have in their section. They are a dead set credit. In fact, while many were shortchanged & caused turmoil by the Aussies & not competing; I feel most sorry for this section. The crews & results they had, ages of the crews; as Bof stated to me later – this was our year!

The Chargers (Beach, Board, Ski, Swim), had some big changes in the offseason & replacing surf club legends was never going to be easy. They could have sat back, not acted & the section would have gone backwards. While there is not enough room here to pass on commendations for everything – they grabbed the ‘ball & ran with it’. They moved forward

strongly, reformatted the structure, planned strongly, set goals, trained hard, dedicated themselves & emphasised what they wanted for their section. Some young adults very quickly became leaders & mentors, and they fulfilled these roles very well. They also are a credit.

The results (outlined elsewhere) followed as they started early & concentrated on the 6 event Summer of Surf series (which essentially replaced the Nutri-Grain series) & also added the 17’s category to it. Their results here got the North Cronulla name out there often as the TV coverage was beamed around. This series scaffolded of course with all of the other major events, which they attended with success. Congratulations & thanks for their efforts, time, dedication & spirit must go to the coaches : Head Coach Tracey.S; Will, Jake, Rob, Nick, Adam, Tom & Nikki (with the girls). While there were many helpers (as there is plenty of equipment), a special mention of thanks must go to Jodee, Andrew & Barb – again for their tireless efforts, time & dedication to the section & Club.

The IRB section which continues to grow & thrive under Skipper Joel Eaton. A vital section of dedicated members for every weekend, as need dictates they compete away from everyone else in the cooler winter months. This they have done with continued success & commitment; which you can see comes from their strong training regimes & abilities. This was highlighted by a 5th place finish at Aussies and a Gold Medal for the Women’s Rescue event, as well as having 7 members selected for the Interstate team. A tremendous result for this super section of the Club.

The March Past section, with Club legends, Life members & experienced clubpersons, were at it again. Led by "Queen Bee" Lenore McKinnery they trained regularly, showing the commitment & attitude to their events. Essentially 2 teams competing at the major carnivals – Open & 23's. While it is always difficult in a subjective scoring event – they competed with success at the major carnivals, bringing home a bronze & silver from Branch; 2 silvers from State; and a silver from Aussies. Well done to all & see you back next year to top that.

The R&R section as always & has been the case for quite some time now, were strong & successful again, posting great results from the major carnivals. Led by section head Kristine Whitford (coaching too), and well & truly supported by the other successful & experienced R&R coaches – Ben, Karen & Monica. They were very well backed up by a dedicated, hard-working & supportive Manager of the section in Bree. While some changes to personnel & to numbers meant sometimes teams had to be changed or could not attend every carnival. While this was likely awkward to manage, they still posted great results & had a very successful season. This was highlighted by: Branch (4 silver & 2 bronze); State (2 gold, 1 bronze) & Aussies (2 gold) – as well as when you look at results, always finishing top 6 & scoring points at these carnivals. A deep and consistent section. Thank you to all for your efforts & dedication, and congratulations.

Our Masters section, led by Karen Goman, was quite small with just a select few this year competing; apart of course from the senior Boat crews, which are extremely strong & successful. 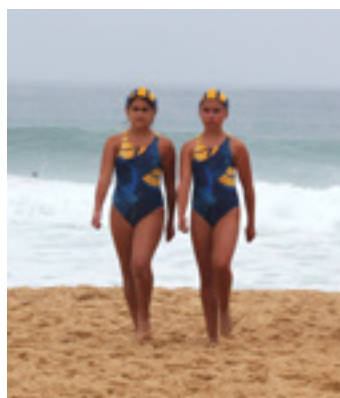

Overall, this has been an exciting and informative, and I find myself looking with great excitement towards the coming seasons.

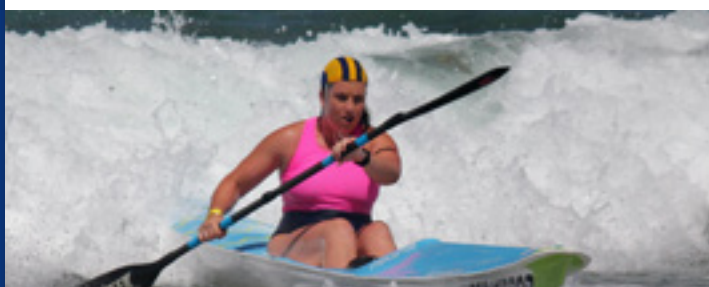

SWIM SECTION REPORT

OVERVIEW

The swim section at North Cronulla is solid. Over the past 10 years we have been slowly re-building, along with the rest of the NC chargers and during this time we have always had a foundation of strong swimmers through the age groups. This remained the same this season with the age groups producing an array of awesome results.

However, this season we have reached a new milestone where we have been able to attain competitive swimmers in open, team and individual events. With an all-rounded team, we were able to showcase our club's talent in the already strong craft legs in the most prestigious event, the male and female open taplin relay. The highlight of this was at the NSW State Titles where we had not only our Open A male team placing 5th but also the B team and the Open female team within the top 10.

Apart from results, the whole NC chargers crew upheld integrity and showed great sportsmanship through the highs and lows of the 2017 surf life saving season.

TRAINING

With the help of my apprentice Jimmy Southwell, this season saw the morning surf sessions continue which gave the athletes a break from staring at the black line one morning a week. These sessions were skill based and were always followed by a B&E coffee combo from the kiosk.

With help from the RNR section, we were able to run Belt, Tube and RTR sessions to give the swimmers a chance to practice leading up to the big events. This season also saw many of the swim "specialists," come down to the Wednesday and Saturday ironman sessions sticking it to the rest of the squad.

COMPETITION

Through the first half of the season our competition was focused on the 'Summer of surf' series which saw the NC chargers travel up and down the east coast where we showed we weren't a force to be reckoned with. The U17 swimmers not only dominated across both genders in their age group, but they stepped up to help the opens in team events which resulted in our mugs getting TV time on several occasions.

The NSW state titles provided some challenging racing conditions where some events were cancelled. However, with the events on offer, the swim section sure delivered. Highlights were taking out Gold and silver in the U17 and U19 Male surf teams respectively, Zac Roja (U15) and Sophie Crawford (U14) claiming Double Silver in both their surf race and iron person, Emma Brown placing 8th in the open female swim, Four open males making the swim final as well as solid swims across all team events in all age groups.

The Australian Titles saw for even more water events to be cancelled. However, we were still able to walk away with some silverware in the swim section claiming 2nd in the U17 surf team (Zac Deifenbac, Ben Highfeild, Nick Hards, Leo Nosatti) as well as Zac Roja claiming silver in the U15 surf race and Sophie Crawford's 5th place in the U14 Surf race.

The pool rescue section, although small, is very strong where Ethan and Jett Garland and Emily Maythers excelled in several events throughout the season. The highlight of which was the 2017 Australian Pool life saving championships. Ethan collected a massive medal Haul of 12 gold, 1 silver and 2 bronze and received the John Stacpoole Memorial Cup for his performance. Jett also came home with 3 Gold, 1 Silver and

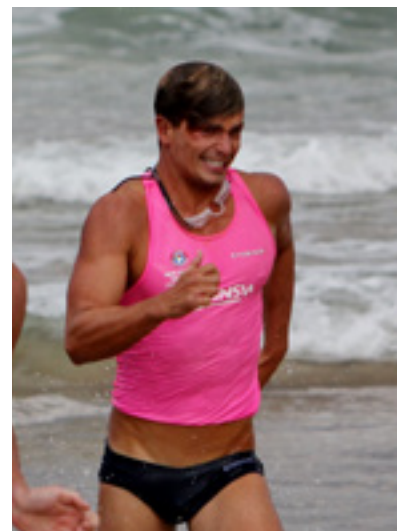
It has been an absolute pleasure to captain such a team of legends. Thanks to everyone involved, from management through to the athletes, train hard, stay safe and I will see you all next season!

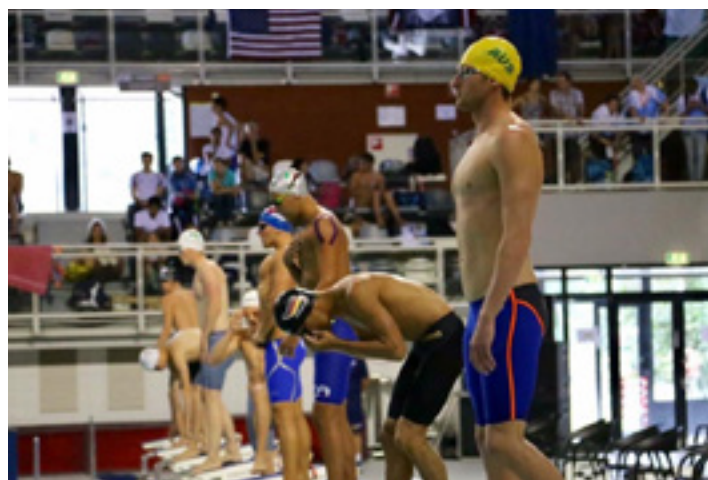

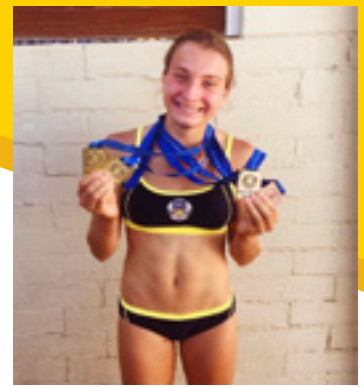

Fresh from having completed their SRC, the U14's accompanied by a few U15s, provided the first water safety of the season at Wet'n'Wild. JAG SECRETARY REPORT

It was a busy start to the season with Registration kicking off in early September for 4 Sundays with a number of children getting in early for their run, swim, run to enable them to get an early start on Carnival participation. We followed the initiative taken last year and had a family day at Kurnell in week 3 which included a sausage sizzle. There were many happy faces as the nippers got to partake in fun activities including tube and board rescues.

We had a pre-season Squad Leader Information night which included an address by Rebecca Wyse on protocols of taking photographs on the beach by parents and passers-by and also suggestions on how to deal with suspicious activity around the nippers. Again we have encouraged all those involved to get their WWC check. We also established at this meeting clear protocols on the requirements of water safety and those of Squad Leaders on a Sunday to ensure the safety and active participation of all nippers.

This year we introduced a new Point Score Program. In response to feedback from parents, nippers and Squad Leaders we reviewed past practices and implemented a new system whereby we only had one Point Score, split over two Sundays, focusing on water one week and beach the next. This was to try and improve attendance on Competition days and also get all nippers to try all events rather than just those they feel they could manage in one session. Overall feedback has been very positive particularly noting the Carnival atmosphere provided by our two Deputy Directors. This has resulted in a change to way points are accumulated, one series from the Point Score Days and the other being a combination of the Point Score Days, and attendance and results at 4 Way Carnival and Cronulla Carnival. This has also opened up more Sundays in the Nipper Calendar to education of the Nippers on Sundays and extra time on skill building.

Attendance at Carnivals has been very good starting with the

Sydney Water Series and culminating in Branch and State where we had approximately 120 nippers competing, proudly wearing the blue & gold. State Nippers returned to Swansea this year following a wet few State Carnivals at Umina and the sun shone intermittently for the three days. Hopefully even more so next year. SYDNEY BRANCH DELEGATE REPORT

Congratulations Donna Hargreaves, the committee for a great 2016/17 season leading the North Cronulla Junior section

North Cronulla Juniors represented themselves well across a range of carnivals throughout the season and across all competition disciplines. It was great to see the efforts and team spirit of all our nippers shining through.

Most importantly, Sunday morning nippers continues to evolve, being an enjoyable and safe place for all our members – both the children and parents/carers. Our focus on education and learning lifesaving skills ensured we maintained our development of lifesavers of the future. The pinnacle is seeing the 14's complete their SRC and begin their community service by patrolling our beach. As the 14's move into the senior section, we wish them all the very best and hope they have many great memories of nippers and continue to enjoy the surf lifesaving movement for many years to come.

Again this year Doug Hawkins was our Sydney Branch Junior development Director, and showed his passion for developing lifesavers of the future. In addition to their North Cronulla commitments, Donna Hargreaves supported Doug as Secretary, whilst Mike Day was on the Board of Surf Sports.

There were only 2 meetings held during the surf season this year.

The first meeting for the season was led by the 2016/17 Junior Lifesavers of the year who presented their views back to the committee. It was a proud moment for North Cronulla as our own Michael De Francesco presented. Their ideas of how to improve retention and making the 14's nipper year less competitive and more fun were widely accepted.

The junior branch remained in a solid financial position for the year with the support of Sydney Airports being the second

year of a three year agreement. The biggest spend for the year remains the development camps which cost \$48K. The emergency response kits however have yet to be delivered.

On the competition front, a levy of \$5 per competitor was levied this year as the branch championships become more expensive to run. To run a carnival of over 1,400 competitors, requiring 300 officials is a big event. This year the branch also introduced the ratio of 1 official to 10 competitors – it was great to see North Cronulla well over their target and an example here to other clubs. 1km and 2km events were also included in the championships to align to the introduction of these events at the State level.

During the season the ABC filmed a TV series on Nippers choosing 2 Sydney clubs – one on the Northern Beaches and South Maroubra from Sydney branch. TV crews were present at local and the Branch carnivals and it will be great to see this on our screens.

Development camps were once again held this season for the 13's and 11's and were a great success. It was noted that a third of branch clubs however are not sending any participants. Whilst these camps are a significant cost subsidised by the branch they are highly regarded with great active participation from everyone who attends. It was noted however that the camps are becoming more female weighted in attendees which creates logistical issues.

Thanks for a great 2016/17 season, and we look forward to building on momentum as we go into next year.

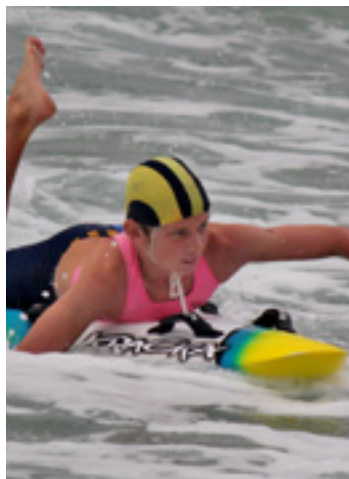

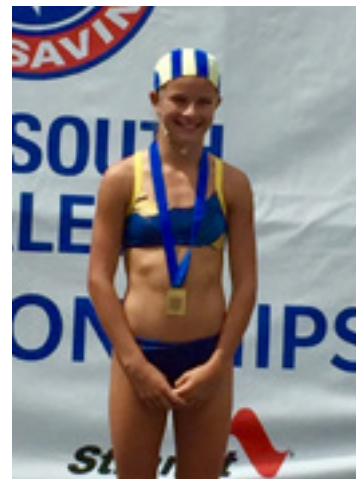

Additionally, as an enthusiastic volunteer and strong advocate for women swimmers, Shirley was also awarded Life Membership of the Cronulla RSL Swimming Club, being the Club's first female recipient of that honour.

A foundation member of the Lilli Pilli Football (Soccer) Club, Shirley was integral to the formation of the initial clubhouse, canteen and soccer facilities.

In 2015 Shirley was awarded an OAM by Governor Marie Bashir in recognition of her volunteer work for the surf lifesaving community.

Shirley is survived by husband Allan, aged 93 and a long-time Life Member of NCSLSC, son Stewart, a veteran member, daughter Jenny, grandchildren Karl, Jana, Kyle and Curtis; all of whom are or were members of NCSLSC and 1 great grandson, Anton.

John will always be recognised for his outstanding contribution to our Club to Surf Life Saving nationwide, and he will be missed by many in Surf Lifesaving around the nation.

John Dewey served the North Cronulla SLSC for 64 years in many capacities.

After gaining his Bronze Medallion and carrying out Patrol duties, John quickly realised his talent was to be involved in the administration of our Club and this is where his membership shone.

Over many seasons he nominated for office and in all of these positions he carried out with great distinction.

His administrative career commenced as Race Secretary organising the Sunday races each weekend.

To highlight this claim in 1968 North Cronulla organised the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships. They were conducted at the Elouera beach less than a km from North Cronulla. John being the Club Secretary also held the position of Championship Secretary. He carried out this position with great distinction and dedication. In fact during the entire Championship he was positioned back at North Cronulla in a small office never to see one event at Elouera beach.

The respect for him grew and he was elected the Club's Deputy President and eventually our Club President. As well, John also held the important position of Touring Team Manager, leading our Club to many Australian Championships around the country.

John's Surf Lifesaving career changed course. He became a Surf Lifesaving Examiner which placed him on the Board of Examiners for the Sydney Branch and ultimately John held the important position of Branch Superintendent, responsible for the proper conduct of Lifesaving from Bondi Beach to Burning Palms.

He carried out such a fine role he moved onto to be the Superintendent of Surf Life Saving NSW.

Became a delegate to the National Body and a member of the National Board of Reference who set the Lifesaving standards for Australia.

As well, John was an outstanding Surf Carnival Official.

He refereed many Sydney and NSW Championships as well as being an outstanding Sectional Referee at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships.

For his dedication to Surf Life Saving John was recognised for his services being honoured with Life Membership of:-

JOHN STEWART MYERS

On New Year's Eve 2016 we lost one of our longest serving Club members, John Myers aged 92 in his 78th year with his beloved North Cronulla Surf Club.

John attempted to join Cronulla Surf Club in 1937 but was refused membership due to his young age. He therefore moved on to North Cronulla and joined as a Probationary Junior. He served the Club as a dedicated patrol member.

Whilst being Vice Captain of the Club and on patrol in March 1950, John effected a belt rescue of a mate and fellow lifesaver Ronald Isley from a swamped surfboat. During the rescue, lighting struck the water killing one swimmer. Despite effects of shock, John swam on to complete the rescue.

It is thanks to John and the efforts of his family that some time ago we were gifted John's prized possession being his first surf board purchased in 1937 for seven pounds (\$14.00). It is a solid custom-made redwood board made by Burns Timber Yard at Caringbah. This board is now one of our most valuable memorabilia possessions and has pride of place on the stairway above the entry to our Harry Brown Room. It proudly displays the names of our 50 Year Service Members.

The board is particularly special as it is one of the last builds of solid timber prior to the move to balsa and then fibreglass. It is basically a copy of that made in Sydney for and shaped by Duke Kahanamoku during his visit to Sydney from Honolulu in 1915.

John's ashes were scattered at a private family function at North Cronulla Beach in June 2017.

CYRIL NETHERY

Lancaster Man, Rugby Player and Surfer.

"One of the most rewarding and joyous things I have ever done was to fly POWs back to England from the camps in Europe", said former Flight Lieutenant Cyril Nethery, who passed away aged 96, in March 2016.

Nethery was a Lancaster Man, one of the elite 5 group 50 Squadron which specialised in low level night attacks on strategic targets, such as the V1 and V2 rocket sites, U-boat pens, armament factories and the battleship Turpitz.

Cyril joined North Cronulla SLSC in the 1939-40 surfing season as an active senior and due to his physique was immediately co-opted into the Boat Department becoming a very successful rower.

In 1941-42 Cyril was the Club's Assistant Secretary before joining the RAAF and being sent to England to be trained in bomber aircraft. Whilst serving in England, he and well-known Sydney solicitor Bruce Mills, helped organise the first Australian-style Surf Lifesaving Carnival to be held in Britain. A combined Australian Services team put on an exhibition at Newquay Beach which attracted a large crowd. Both men were welcomed back in 1995 to celebrate 50 years of surf lifesaving in Great Britain.

On Cyril's return to Australia he resumed his membership with NCSLSC and once again was active as a boat rower, enjoying greatly the spirit and comradery engendered by the Boat Department. In 1946-47 Cyril was a member of the NC SLSC Management Committee.

An outstanding football forward, Cyril played for both St George Rugby League and St George Rugby Union Clubs, where the unfortunate timing of a broken leg in 1947, prevented his inclusion in the Australian Rugby Union Wallaby squad.

Always a campaigner for social justice, Cyril was awarded a Medal of Australia in 1985 for his involvement with St Vincent de Paul and their work with indigenous and disadvantaged members of our community.

Cyril is survived by his wife Valmarie (aged 93), his six children, 12 grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Several of Cyril's grandsons went on to be active members of NCSLSC.

Cyril's Son Michael summed up his dad's favourite recreations; "fresh prawns, an each-way bet on the trots, a surf in the alley at North Cronulla on an autumn day, a few holes of golf at twilight and a cold beer."

FRANK PENDER

Frank, as a thirteen year old, joined North Cronulla as a Cadet Member in the 1953-54 Season and obtained his Qualifying Certificate in December in 1953. He gained his Bronze Medallion in January 1956.

He was champion of the Woronora Royal Lifesaving Club and our Cadet Champion in his initial year. His swimming prowess allowed him early success and he went on to a competitive career centred on swimming and R&R.

Frank's competition record in R&R as a Junior commenced in 1956 with winning gold in the Metropolitan and NSW Championships and silver at the Australian Championships and in 1957 followed with gold at the Metropolitan Championships.

Frank moved into the Senior ranks in 1957/58 for seven years, two in A Grade and five in B Grade and also coached the Junior R&R.

In addition to competition Frank was a Patrol Vice Captain and Patrol Captain.

Along with many other Club members he played Sub-District Rugby in the off season. North Cronulla SLSC RUFC was one of the first teams selected to play in the then newly formed Second Division of Sydney Rugby. After a name change to Port Hacking RUFC THE Club eventually morphed into today's Southern Districts RUFC.

Frank was part of the Club's development period in the fifty and sixties, this period an important part of NCSLSC history as it laid the foundations for later competitive success and lifesaving innovations.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2017

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' and AASB 1048 'Interpretation and Application of Standards', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities. These financial statements do not conform with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ('IASB').

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Income Tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2017

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Trade and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure statement.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant & equipment over the useful life as follows:

Class of Fixed Asset	Useful Life
Office Equipment	3-5 Years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date. An item of property, plant & equipment is derecognised upon disposal of when there is no future economic benefits to the association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and Other Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included in other receivables or other payables in the Statement of Financial Position. Cash flows are presented on a gross basis.

2 Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2017

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated (the Club), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2017, the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the directors' declaration.


