President's Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated, it gives me great pleasure to submit for your consideration and adoption the 88th Annual Report and Financial Statements for Season 2012-2013.

The Financial Statements contained in this Report have been prepared by our Finance Director, Ben Smollett and audited by BDO Chartered Accountants.

I am extremely proud to report on behalf of our membership that *"No Lives Were Lost"* at North Cronulla beach during the 2012 to 2013 patrol season. Congratulations to all Members of the Club who volunteered their time to perform Patrols throughout the season and to help achieve this result.

The season was full of challenges for our new Executive, Board of Directors and the overall Club Membership – but they all rose to the occasion, took on additional duties as required and achieved pleasing results across all of the key functions within the Surf Club operations and areas of responsibility.

This season saw the development of a Club Management Plan (CMP) that will run for the next three seasons. The Mission Statement of the CMP is: *To provide a safe, enjoyable, inclusive, family orientated environment delivering quality Volunteer Lifesaving, Competition and Education services and facilities to our Members and the Community*

The CMP is a dynamic and living plan based on six key functions of Surf Life Saving and Patrols, Training and Education, Competition (Surf Sports), Finance and Administration, Member Services and Community that can be updated, modified, adjusted and continually developed based on the both internal and external factors, events and pressures applied on the day to day operational of our Surf Club and its governing bodies.

The major asset of our Club is its Members and this year is no exception to this statement. At the "Annual Blue & Gold Gala Presentation Night" – which was run under a new format and was an excellent night. We saw our Club Members honoured by the peers as recipients of the Club's Most Prestigious Awards:

Ben Smollett – "C.N. Rees Memorial Trophy" – Most Outstanding Club Member of the Year.

Jason Gallon – "Mario Peryman Memorial Trophy" – Lifesaver of the Year.

Joel Eaton – "Tom Payne Memorial Grant" – Outstanding contribution to a specific Club area.

Our Nipper Section under the direction of Michelle Sheldon and her team, had a very challenging but rewarding year. The overall membership numbers were slightly down on previous seasons and the surf conditions at normal Sunday events and NSW Age State Championship were not ideal for learning, development and increasing their competition skills of our future Lifesavers.

The number of Surf Rescue Certificates awarded at beginning of the year was a great result with over 50 SRCs awarded to our Under-14 Nippers – who are our future Lifesavers and we will have next season a similar number of Nipper Members gaining their first SLSA Award.

To all Nipper Members who officiated and provided education as part of SLS Sydney Board of Junior Development activities – thank you for your time and effort and to our Members who performed Water Safety at carnivals and our Sunday events – your efforts are greatly appreciated by the Club.

As mentioned before, we have introduced a Club Management Plan and these are some of the highlights of each area for the season past.

Surf Life Saving & Patrols

The Members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club recorded the following activities during Patrol Season:

- Performed approximately 13,000 Volunteer Patrol hours across 14 Rostered Patrols
- Recorded 107 Rescues
- Involved in over 2000 Preventative Actions
- Attended to 188 First Aid cases
- Looked after 24 lost children.

The number of recorded Rescues and Preventative Actions are trending below three year average and this was due to improved Patrol and Beach Management skills and the increase in the number of days the beach was closed due to dangerous surf conditions.

This year we had an increase in Members who gained their 100 % Patrol Attendance and 12 of these Members achieved over 100 hours of Patrol Duty and one Club Member achieved 187 hours of Patrol Duty on our beach. Overall, this highlights the dedication of our Members to their core duty which is Surf Life Saving and performing Patrols.

To all of our Patrol Captains, Vice Patrol Captains, IRB Drivers and Crew and patrolling Members – congratulations of another season of keeping the surfing public safe and thank you for your time and effort in maintaining high standards of Patrol Duties

These efforts were recognised at the Annual SLS Sydney Awards of Excellence – with Members of North Cronulla awarded the "Under-15 Life Saver" – two successful Branch nominations "Rescue of the Month" for November 2012 and January 2013 – and won the "Patrol Efficiency Competition" for the Bate Bay area.

Training & Education:

Under the leadership and guidance of Jason Gallon, our Director of Training and Education, his team of Trainers and our Club Members achieved the following:

- 54 Surf Rescue Certificates
- 63 Bronze Medallions
- 2 Gold Medallions
- 11 Silver Medallion Beach Management
- 11 IRB Crew Certificate
- 32 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates
- Numerous Specialised Awards
- 6 New qualified Training Officers for BM, ATRC, Spinal and IRB
- 2 new Bronze Medallion Assessors.

The target for the Team this year was to deliver quality training and produce high calibre candidates rather than quantity. The standard of our candidates were of the highest level and testament to the quality of our Trainers and their training methods.

This gave us a total of 207 Awards and that was the highest for the Bate Bay area Surf Clubs and placed us fifth in the overall Branch standings. The achievements of Jason were recognised at the SLS Sydney Awards of Excellence with a "High Commendation for Training Officer of the Year".

Competition (Surf Sports)

On the Surf Sports area, our Club Members enjoyed a very good season and delivered great results at International, National, State, Branch and local carnivals.

Results at the major championship carnivals were:

- 9th Australian Open Championships
- 3rd New South Wales Open Championships
- 7th New South Wales Age Championships
- 2nd Surf Life Saving Sydney Branch Championships
- 1st Bate Bay Interclub ("Bill Marshall Trophy")

The results of our Team and individual competitors cannot be achieved without the support and guidance of our Section Leaders, Section Coaches and Club Head Coach.

I know you all love our sport of Surf Life Saving and watching our competitors grow in confidence and skills over the season – is certainly a great reward for all of your efforts.

During the season, our Club Captain Jamie Primmer and his Team successfully held the North Cronulla Christmas Carnival – which has been running for over 30 years – the Annual Bate Bay Interclub Carnival, Australia Day Nipper Iron Person Classic and co-hosted the Nipper 4-Way Carnival.

We now have a strong IRB Team, who compete regularly during the winter season at all levels of IRB Competition and this is leading to increase Members in this Section to

One area of concern was the lack of a dedicated Competition Director during the season and I thank Geoff Budd our Deputy President, who stood in the role for a short period. Alternate strategies were implemented by our Club Captain and other Executive Members to cover this issue and the above results prove these measures worked.

Finance and Administration

We embarked on a successful upgrade of our Club IT Environment, including new email platform, Office software and upgrades to Club Membership and Accounting Software Packages. The Administration Office furniture upgrade and fit-out was kindly donated by one of our Club Sponsors and will continue through winter in preparation for the new season.

The new Club Secretary – Tracey McKinnier, introduced several major Administration changes this season, including the Administration Office fit-out and upgrade, improved the level and detail of communication to our Membership, development of new job descriptions for Club positions, created a new Club Calendar and introduced a new format for our "Blue & Gold Gala Presentation Night" that was very successful and enjoyed by all who attended.

To our Finance Director – Ben Smollet, thank you for another year of managing the Club financial affairs with the high level of dedication, attention to detail and responsible Financial Management. We are able to report a small trading profit, accounts are paid, we funded increased expenditure on Surf Life Saving equipment to the standards and inventory required to provide our community service of patrolling our beach. An objective for next season is to improve and increase our Club fundraising activities to cover the very large competition expenditure including NSW State, Australian and general carnival and competition expenses.

We are very fortunate to have several long term and key Sponsors and supporters of North Cronulla SLSC and their support is critical to allow us to provide the high level of training services, equipment required for competition, Life Saving and Patrol duties. To all of our Sponsors – thank you for your continued support of the Club – and your donations are greatly appreciated.

The Social Calendar was under review this season and new events and activities were introduced to the social benefit of Members and their families. Stephen Brown – our Social Organiser worked tirelessly arranging and managing Judd Room Bar roster and was supported by the Club Section Leaders at various social events held during the season. Towards the end of the season, successful changes were made to Event and Bar timetables that were well received by our Club Members and will ensure we continue to socialise over the winter months.

There were two events this season that we need to recognise the success of these and ensure they continue as very important events on our Fundraising Calendar.

“NC Golf Day” – Critical Annual Fundraiser organised and managed by Brook Fleming and Dave Waugh.

“Boaties Sportsmen Lunch” – held at Caringbah Tradies in honour of Steve Swane – who has 50 Years of Service in Senior and Open Competition – and the event was organised by Liam Donohue and his team.

Our Ladies Committee lead by Julie Howell, once again provided support at our major events including North Cronulla Christmas Carnival, AGM, Gold Medal Winners Night, IRB Launches, Sponsorship Breakfast and other Social and Sponsorship events throughout the season.

The Club Ballroom kitchen will be renovated over the next six months and this will increase the appeal and ability of this room to support our own social activities and generate income from rental of the facility.

Youth Development and Membership retention is critical to the continued success of our Club and the development of our young Members. Over the last few seasons, Lee Howell with support from our Nipper Section, have managed a series of events and overall program that is delivering on its objectives.

There are great opportunities available to our young Members at all levels of the Association and we must strive to provide a safe and welcoming environment for our kids – so they can be guided and develop into future Surf Lifesavers, Competitors and valued Members of society.

“Project Phoenix” refers to the redevelopment of the North Cronulla SLSC Gear Complex. This activity has been around for several seasons in various formats and designs and we have reached agreement upon a future course of action. At present, we are engaging architects and working on business case and plan for the development. The Club will need to fund the initial stage to cover the architect engagement, business case and plan, concept designs, development application and construction certificate and tender documentation. Depending upon the time required by Sutherland Shire Council or Joint Regional Planning Committee assessment of our plans, this activity could take 18 months before we are ready to

start construction. To fund this activity we need to endeavour to save \$60,000 to \$75,000 over the next two to three seasons to offset these costs.

Member Services

This function was covered by the Club Secretary and other Club Officers and will be again in season 2013-2104.

A new director position will be created called Member Services Director as part of the review of our constitution currently underway and due for completion early 2014 and adoption at the 2014 AGM or at a Special General Meeting.

Community

We continue of support our local community and business owners at many different levels within the Club.

Our local Council Lifeguards use our heated pool and Club facilities to provide Surf Awareness to hundreds of local school children and provide learn to swim and water awareness programs to children with learning disabilities.

Sutherland Shire Council and our local community benefits from our Surf Life Saving – Patrolling and Training and Education Activities – and we in turn greatly value their support and maintenance of the Club buildings and facilities.

There are many water and special events held at North Cronulla Beach over a season and it requires support from the Council and our Club Members – to ensure these are run successfully and in partnership.

The “Cook Community Classic” held in November 2012 with participation from the local Bate Bay Surf Clubs and local Community Organisations were involved in the event and generated increased public awareness of the capabilities and talents of our younger Nipper Members.

Our Club Members and Patrols perform over 13,000 Volunteer Patrols hours to keep our local community safe at North Cronulla Beach and provided Beach Management and messages to help educate the surfing public on the dangers of the surf and awareness of the changing surf conditions.

To the other Bate Bay Surf Life Saving Clubs – and on behalf of all North Cronulla Members – I congratulate you for another successful year of Competition, Training and Education and performing our core duty and responsibility of Patrolling our great beaches. To the Executive Members who are part of Cronulla Sutherland District Council, thank you for your counsel this season and continued support of our collective and individual objectives as Surf Life Saving Clubs.

In the role as President – you are only as successful as the Team supporting you. To our hard working Club Executive consisting of Tracey, Ben, Geoff, Jamie and Lee – thank you for your support and dedication to your Club, your positions and our plan and direction for the season. To the Board of Directors – and other standing Committees in the Club – congratulations on your season and continued support of the ideals of Surf Life Saving and upholding the mission statement and objectives of our Club.

All our Members, both current and past, can be extremely proud of our achievements this year, because it once again reinforces that we are one of the Best Surf Life Saving Clubs in Australia – and the best in Bate Bay area! Well done everybody – thank you for your “Vigilance and service” – dedication to your Patrol Duties and ongoing support of your Club. See you back on the beach in Season 2013-2104. Finance Director's Report

As Finance Director and on behalf of the Board of Directors I am proud to present the 2012-2013 Audited Financial Statements.

The Financial Statements show a profit of \$3,804 for the year (2012 \$6,288).

Cash generated from operating activities during this Financial Year of \$77,287 – was invested in Capital Equipment for Lifesaving, Clubhouse Assets and Competition to value of \$77,872. As such there has been a minor increase in cash held of \$4,326.

One key area I would like to direct your attention to, is Club Revenue of \$759,403 (2012 – \$759,332).

This points out no increase in revenue for the 2013 financial year. With continual increases in building and operational costs, we must be sure to work hard to increase our revenue streams to ensure we can support the ever increasing costs associated with operating a Surf Club.

These results indicate that although we carry the status as a registered charity, it is constant challenge to obtain new Sponsors and maintain current Club Sponsorship and donation revenue. Members need to work hard supporting our contributors to ensure we receive their continued support.



Although the results are not strong, but stable – they reflect the continued hard work done by Section Leaders and Members and the continued support of Sponsors for all capital equipment purchases. I hope this work continues and Members stay active in seeking out new Sponsorship and fundraising opportunities – and also in ensuring we continue to support our current Sponsors in every capacity possible.

Thank you again to the Office Administration Team of Sheridan, Glenn-Marie and Melissa, who have once again been a great help throughout the season.

I also wish to thank Sean Wright, Robin Gani and Chris Allen from BDO for their assistance throughout the audit process.

Finally, I believe the Board and I have again provided a financially responsible set of Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2013 – and I look forward to contributing to a positive and successful 2014 year.

Club Secretary's Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I present for your consideration and adoption the 88th Annual Report and Financial Statements of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club for the Season 2012-2013.

Another season has come to an end and we now have the opportunity to reflect on the achievements and in some cases, the disappointments we experienced as a Club during the past season.

I'm unsure how other Board Members feel, but in my first year it feels like one continuous season.

Once again, we can say *No Lives Lost* during the season. As a Surf Life Saving Club, we should never forget that this is and will always be our primary objective.

As a Club we are extremely fortunate to have a fantastic team of Members who have dedicated their service to this objective and as such, they freely devoted their time to keeping our beach safe and expect nothing in return.

Worthy of note are our Members who have over 100 hours of Patrol Service, Members who achieved 100% Patrol Attendance and all the Members who have achieved an award to enable them perform these volunteer duties.

In recognising the "volunteer" nature of our organisation I quote "the largest volunteer movement of its kind in Australia and the World." SLSA 2012-2016 Strategic Plan.

It is important to pause and reflect on the term volunteer and what exactly that looks like within North Cronulla.

- A Volunteer Lifesaver at North Cronulla helped contribute close to 13 000 Volunteer Patrol Hours for 2012-2013.
- A Volunteer Instructor at North Cronulla contributed to the training of Members who achieved over 200 awards.
- A Volunteer Finance Director managed well over half a million dollars in annual turnover.

- A Volunteer in Administration who averaged 100 pieces of correspondence per month.

In our Volunteer Organisation, there are many more examples in addition to those listed that demonstrate that as a volunteer – we do make a difference to the community – volunteers change lives and in the case of our institution we make a difference in that we can and do save a life.

The Volunteer Movement is the most important mechanism in this country for capturing the values of caring and compassion and mateship and going the extra mile and looking after one's fellow Australian.

No better example of the caring, compassion and mateship that we provide, was demonstrated on the final day of the Patrol Season for 2012-2013. Whilst celebrating the Annual "Bloody Slow Cup" results, sitting in the Judd Room, by himself, reading a book and having a beer was David Gingell – a tourist from England. David was in Australia on a family holiday and felt it important to visit North Cronulla to "have a beer" – why? Whilst previously visiting Australia in 2008, David was rescued whilst swimming at North Cronulla. By all accounts he was in significant difficulties and as he recalls he "thought he was gone".

In preparing this report as the Secretary, on reflection, this was perhaps the most significant moment for me personally of the season. In a season of many highlights and challenges, it is moments like this for me that make the incredibly demanding workload of the Secretary worthwhile.

The preparation of not just the Secretary's Report and the entire Annual Report together with the normal responsibilities of the Secretary such as the management of correspondence, monthly Board Meeting obligations, the organisation of significant Club events such as Presentation Evening, Sponsorship functions and support of Lifesaving, Education and Competition programs, has

made for an incredibly demanding and at times unrealistic workload of a volunteer who works in a full time job.

At this stage I need to pause to highlight perhaps some of the challenges and disappointments of the past season.

Members are reluctant to accept and perform major roles within the Organisation because of the scrutiny they are placed under by both the Organisation itself and fellow Members and parents. This is no more clearly demonstrated within our own Club for this past season – with absence of a Competition Director and Lifesaving Director since the end of February 2013.

Acknowledgement needs to be made to the rest of the Board, together with the Office Staff for the additional responsibilities that have been assumed to compensate for these vacant positions.

Our Members have talents, skills and abilities that need to be utilised within the Club in areas they feel competent and confident in. With the skills and experience I possess from my professional life, I hope to continue to serve North Cronulla in some capacity in the coming season with the support of Members, who are prepared to accept responsibilities and take on leadership roles.

Life Saving Director's Report

Our Life Saving Director – Jessica Burgess, carefully assigned Club Members based on their skills and qualifications – to each of the Patrols and assigned Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and IRB Drivers and Crew – to give North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club a roster of 14 Patrols for the season. The number of Patrols increased from 12 to 14 based on the strong leadership of the Patrol Captains in the previous season and enough high calibre and suitably qualified Members to fill the Vice-Captain and IRB Driver and Crew person roles.

Our Club Membership must understand people are assigned to Patrols for very good reasons – to ensure balanced Patrols covering Life Saving skills, expertise, and SLSCA qualifications – and to meet our obligations under Patrol Service Agreements (PSA) with Surf Life Saving NSW and Standard Operating Procedures for Patrols.

Due to unreasonable pressure from Club Membership and changes to Jessica's work commitments – she could not fulfil this role for the full season, but still remained a Patrol Captain during the season. The Life Saving Committee satisfactorily managed the operations of our Patrols for the remainder of the season.

The overall standard of our Patrols was very high, but there are areas that could be improved and these will be targeted as part of new program for Patrol improvement next season. We had some great support from Active Reserve Members and other Patrol Members, who were asked to help with selected Patrols that struggled with maintaining suitable numbers of Bronze Medallions during the main section of the season over the December to February period.

Patrol Statistics Seasons 2010-2103

The statistics for this Patrol Season reflect a beach that is managed effectively and efficiently by our Patrols and Members. The number of recorded rescues is higher than the previous season – and lower than the three season average of 154 rescues.

Preventative Actions increased when compared to the previous season and is a good result because our Patrols are effecting actions and measures to reduce the risk to the surfing public – before the situation develops into a full blown rescue.

An interesting statistic is the day of time the rescues are performed as listed in table at bottom of the page, indicates that Patrols need to be diligent in their duties at all times.

We had several notable rescues during the season both in the surf and around the beach precinct and included two successful nominations for "Surf Life Saving Sydney Rescue of the Month" – for November 2102 for Kylie Cameron – and January 2103 for Jye Highfield and Lochie Davis. As a testament to the overall performance and high standards of our Patrols, North Cronulla SLSC won the "Surf Life Saving Sydney Patrol Efficiency Competition" for the Bate Bay area.

We introduced the use of an All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) late in the Patrol Season, so our Patrol Captains could gain experience on driving the ATV through the sand and up the ramps while towing IRB and trailer while the beach was less crowded. The ATV will be used from day one of next season, because of the highly successful results and positive feedback from Patrol Captains this season.

To all the Members who gained your 100% Patrol Attendance – congratulations of your effort and special mention to Amanda Duran – who gained 10 Years 100% Patrol Attendance. We had 12 Members gain over 100 hours of Patrol Hours and Steve Cardy achieved 187 hours of Patrol Duty on our beach. Congratulations to all of you and thank you for the extra effort.

To all of our Members who volunteered your time patrolling North Cronulla Beach to the very high standard expected and delivered – we extend a warm and grateful "Thank You" – and hope you enjoyed the experience and the responsibility of keeping the surfing and bathing public safe at North Cronulla Beach.

IRB Section Report

The 2012-2013 Season has been another great one for the IRB Section. We have continued our fantastic growth in Members with large groups of IRB Crewman and Drivers Awards gained. As a result, we have had a Duck Driver on every Patrol for the season. This would not be possible without our Trainers – Sam Freeman and Darren Thorne.

A big credit is due to these guys, as they pass on valuable information to help keep our Surf Club going.

Also a big thanks to everyone who assisted me with can laying duties at carnivals this year. It's always a tough gig being first on the water and last off – and with the Branch seeking to add more carnivals to the calendar every year.

Remember, without this valuable workforce – the carnivals do not go ahead! Our growth in patrolling and retention of IRB Members can also be closely linked to our strong footing in IRB Competition. Due to our successful results last season our recruitment and retention was maintained. Since the reintroduction of IRB Competition six years ago – the Section has kept improving with the numbers of Members and the quality of the gear we use for Patrolling and Competition.

During the 2012 Season, we had 27 Members competing, with at least one Crew in all disciplines – a first time for us as a Section in a very long time. What this equalled with hard work by the Crews and lots and lots of testing of gear was results. 2012 was some of the best results I believe we have ever had as a Club. In the NSW IRB Premiership Series, we finished third overall in the State, with seven Medals at the end – our best result ever improving from the seventh last year. At the NSW IRB State Titles, we finished fifth overall – with five Medals and a numerous amount of Finals with fourth and fifth places in the Mens, Under-23s, 35+ and Women's Divisions – which was great considering the number of injuries we



had. At the IRB Australian at Ocean Beach this year, we made our first Australian Final since 2000 and a heap of other Semi-Finals in tricky big surf. It showed that we will be strong contenders for the Aussies at Darwin in 2013.

Last year was the first time we ever had any IRB athletes make the NSW Interstate Team – with three of our Club Members being selected for the 2012 Season – we had five Members selected for both the NSW Interstate Team and the NSW High Performance Team to compete in the IRB Interstate Championships. I was fortunate enough to be the Captain of the High Performance Team, a great honour to represent my home State two years in a row. Big congratulations to Kane Hughes, Jarrad Kucler, Mitch Cardy and Samuel Freeman, who I was able to not only to call Club Team Mates, but also State Team Mates. I think if we looked back five years ago, this would have been a mere pipe dream for us to be competing at this level. Another first for the Section was to attend our first Rescue World Lifesaving Championships in Glenelg, SA. We had some tremendous results by making a number of Finals to gain valuable points. In the end, we finished 13th in the World as a Club – a great achievement from a small team of 10, going against teams of 30+ Competitors.

All this wouldn't have been possible without our fantastic core group of Sponsors. A big thank you to Caltex, who have a new boat on the way, the SUS Club, All Vehicle Restraints, Alan Freeman, Tradies – and last but not least the Holt Group, who donated a new boat, trailer and motor this year. Our Sponsors ensure the safety of our beaches and our success in the Competition Arena. Once again thank you for your support – and I look forward to an ongoing future with your support.

Last but not least, a big thank you to Bobby Lovell – he has given me so much support over the last six years as IRB Captain – it makes my job much easier!

Thank you and I look forward to your support for the upcoming season.

Once again we sent our Under-14s off for their SRC. Big thanks to the Club Trainers in taking them through the final leg and furthering their Education and showing them how to put it in practice. Congratulations!

Attitude, Amazing, First Aid

We had an amazing Mum who also happened to be a Fire Fighter and an Ambulance Officer Father, who both gave us a great insight into the 000 protocol and how to use it.

Beach Events, Board Paddling, Human Body

Time was spent teaching Beach Sprint and Flag starts down on the beach.

As well as starting the younger ones in the pool with some board rolls and manoeuvres.

We had a great lesson with the Under-13s Group (with the help of white board textas) on the importance of all the major organs and systems in the body and their relationship to healthy living and being a Lifesaver.

Youth Development Branch Delegate's Report

Very much a changing of the guard this year at Northies. It was a difficult season at times – primarily due to weather and sea conditions, but was overall a good one. Nipper numbers were again over 500.

We began with Registration and Swim Proficiencies in September/October. We remain firmly of the view that assessing our children in the pool with proper timed Proficiencies is the safest method to assess their water ability, before we let them near the ocean. It is for that reason that in addition to the SLSA required Proficiencies, our Under-9 and Under-10 Nippers need to complete a 400 metre pool swim inside six minutes – Under-11 to Under-14s, the same distance inside five minutes.

This year saw a new Committee led by Michelle Sheldon (Director), Donna Hargreaves (Secretary) and Kevin Macnamara (Deputy Director). Last season's Training Template with some modifications was reintroduced – placing Board and Surf Swimming as the priorities. Again our Club's Senior Coaches put in huge hours guiding our kids at training. Particular thanks to Stuart Cameron and Tracey Shriek, for leading the weekday Training Sessions in those Disciplines.

The year started with Kieran Hanley and Shannon Glasson elected as Nipper Captains. Our Surf Rescue Certificate Class saw 63 new Lifesavers presented to the Senior Club. Reports back from the various Patrol Captains as to their performance on Patrol have been very positive.

Education & Training Director's Report

Wow – where to begin, this season has been a blur to say the least, but also very rewarding.

When I was asked to step up to the role of Education and Training Director at the last AGM, it was met with a mixture of feelings – from one of honour in just being asked, to one of complete trepidation in fear of failure, based on the fantastic level of Surf Life Savers the North Cronulla Club has produced over recent years, compared to other Bate Bay Clubs.

I can say this openly and it is reflected towards Scott Marshall – who in recent years did this role and also mentored myself into the role of Trainer.

So it is with a large thank you to Scott, that I was able to jump in and have a real go at the role – which I must say I have thoroughly enjoyed.

To the Board of Directors, I thank you for your guidance, understanding and helping the Education and Training Section develop further and in obtaining a grant for an additional training equipment with a new Oxy-viva and Training Defibrillator, which allows us to train larger ARTC groups. I have enjoyed working closely with you all.

The start of the year saw 54 kids take their first real step into becoming Surf Life Savers for the North Cronulla SLSC – in doing their Surf Rescue Certificate – and 48 Bronze Medallion candidates being undertaken.

The next eight weeks saw many challenges for all candidates, but also for myself and our dedicated Trainers in Steve Cardy, Peter Loomes, Mark Anders, Lee Howell, Gavin Duffy, Peter Molye, Max Walker Geoff Budd and Shane Wolbank and some fantastic helpers along the way.

Without their time, help, passion and the understanding of their own families to attend many nights and weekends

training, the 100% success achieved in these Awards would never have been achieved. So thank you all for your time, patience and understanding it is great to know we all have the same goals.

After the initial chaos of the SRC and BM a further three groups of Bronze Medallion candidates were trained with the same 100% success for a total of 63 Bronze Medallions.

With the ongoing guidance of Scott Marshall, both Steve Cardy and I were able to complete our ARTC Training Officers Accreditation, allowing us to train and present a further 32 ARTC candidates for assessment, with all passing and further strengthening our quality of Patrol Awards for the Club.

Steve's previous life as an Ambulance Paramedic has been paramount in the success of all our candidates, as his knowledge and mentoring in this advanced life support award, is second to none.

The IRB Section with Joel and Darren, saw a total of 13 people gain their IRB Crew Certificates, which adds to strengthen our Patrols and IRB Race Team.

The issue of Proficiencies remains one area where the Education and Training Section needs to focus on – so as to make it as fluid as possible, yet meet the requirements of Surf Life Saving's own requirements.

This year saw a total of nine Proficiencies being conducted over various weekends, with most people attending – to most people's surprise, even "Boaties" had a large contingent early on and managed to get through it without too much problem.

However, like most years, there was always the last minute rush and we did have to beg for an extraordinary Proficiency to be carried out Under the guidance of Sydney Branch, which is the only real disappointment I had over the season.

In addition to the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificates gained over the season, the Club also presented a number of candidates for the following awards: Silver Medallion Beach Management, Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, ATV, Training Officer Certificate and Assessors Awards – with great success achieved by all.

It is hoped that these Awards will further strengthen the high skills base on all of the Club's Patrols, making us the best prepared Club in the Bate Bay Area.

To our Office Staff – Sheridan and Glenn-Marie. I thank you for your patience over the last season.

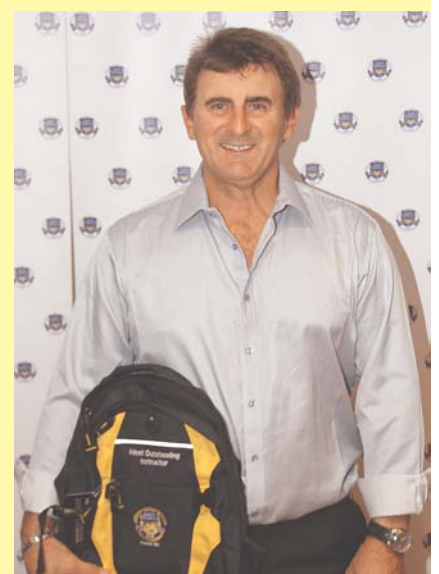

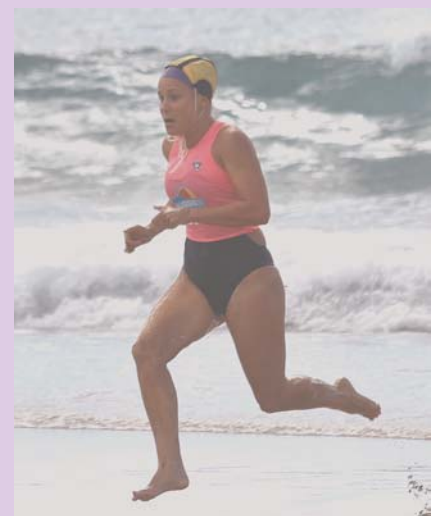

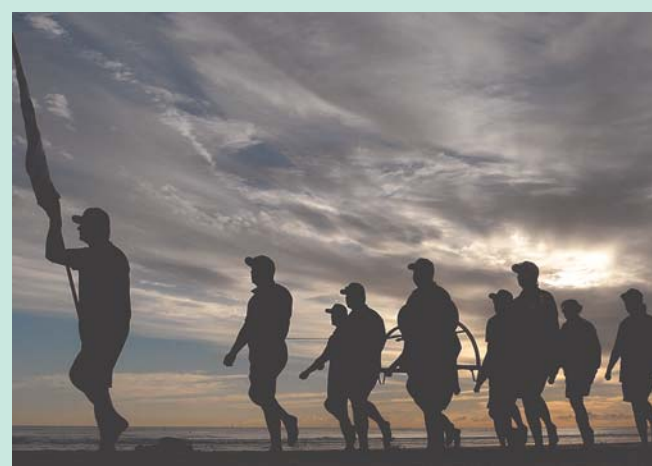

SURF LIFESAVING

Young champs are lauded as heroes

Sport captured the sand and surf around Bate Bay on Australia Day, where **Brad Forrest** and photographer **Chris Lane** found plenty of action, for young and older athletes.

TWO state surf lifesaving champions, but too young to gain their bronze medallion, have been praised for their quick work in saving the lives of two much bigger, and heavier swimmers in choppy surf recently.

They were lauded, appropriately, while competing in the annual Australia Day North Cronulla Junior Ironman carnival on Saturday.

North Cronulla 14-year-old junior lifesavers Jye Highfield and Lochie Davis played down their own efforts, but patrol captain Kane Hughes said their efforts were "quite amazing".

Swimmers rescued

The boys had been on patrol before gaining permission from patrol captain Hughes to go for a paddle near North Cronulla's Alley, popular with boardriders but rated as one of the most dangerous beaches in Sydney because of flash rips and undercurrents.

The two under 15 patrol members, who only had their surf rescue certificate for just over 12 months and are only in their first year away from the Nipper section, were asked to check with the surfers in the area.

They soon discovered two men in distress, outside of the flagged area; one of them had gone under the water and was drowning.

"There was a big swell and I had to quickly get him above water," said Lochie, as Jye came to the assistance of the other swimmer.

They were able to not only retrieve the swimmers but successfully

return them to shore on a rescue board to the waiting patrol, who acted swiftly to apply oxygen therapy to one of the swimmers.

An ambulance was called to take him to Sutherland Hospital.

Kane Hughes, who was in the patrol tower, described their rescue as "one of the best" he had seen.

"Despite the fact that both men were 100 kilograms plus, the boys acted swiftly and professionally," Hughes said.

"As competitors, they recognise that competition helps in developing their lifesaving skills, and these boys are already state board and swim champions."

The Wanda Carnival saw only a four teams competing with Queenscliff winning on countback to us.

Wheeling let us down. It was great to see Warriewood back competing at Wanda.

Manly is always a long march and this year it did not disappoint. With a solid beat from the Manly-Warringah Pipe Band, we marched with confidence and lost only 3 faults in the March (all on Wheeling). We came third on countback to Collaroy Ladies and Caves. This was the best result we have had there for many years.

Wet and cold conditions at the Coogee Carnival in February had teams huddling in the summer sheds and the Judges figuring out what to do. Every time I have been to Coogee “Mother Nature” throws something at you. Bob Hanson remarked after this March that it was our best March of the season to date and that we were on track. This may be something that could have affected our preparation for the Sunday Final . . . it makes you ponder. Bob Taylor once again joined the Coaching Group as well as Gladys, who filled in from time to time in training. Gladys who had great success in the Masters, has been a brilliant Team Member over the years. She has continued to be a loyal Marcher, even though she has not been selected in many competitions. Your diligence in improving performance and knowledge has been applauded by the Team!

Our preparation at Training Sessions was fantastic as the two Bobs pinpointed minor faults in the Team. During the five training sessions at Coolongatta and North Kirra, the Coaches tuned and retuned every aspect with technology being the masterful ace we had. By the last sessions on the Saturday, the two Bobs, “Tubby” and Gladys, could not see a deduction. Wheeling and Spacing were cured and the backline was hitting the pole and closing the gate perfectly. On the evening of our Team Dinner and afterwards it was evident that we had done absolutely all we could in training to prepare for the next morning.

A disgrace that we had to March at 7am in the morning –

the Team met at 5.30am, warmed up and began to march at 6.15am. We were fourth onto the track with a Band that played a beat that gave difficulty to some teams.

We had a mark-time at the start, but this did not affect our performance. With Morrie leading us strongly from the front, we gave our best. The course was long, but the Reel moved comfortably with the front two. Felt good!

Once again the exercising of Down-Reel at the Australians is made to feel rushed and unimportant – this is sad and may be a comment. The Ceremony for our recent loss of young Surf Lifesavers was solemn, but the absence of the National Anthem was an absolute shame!!

With all the confidence and preparation, unfortunately we finished 9th – one point away from 1st. In fact 12 Teams finished within one point of each other. Are we all that good? Do Judges have to be tougher? I don’t want this result to reflect our season. This season demonstrated that we have a fine Team and a great Coaching Group and Support Crew. It is hoped that we can keep our Squad together for next season.

On behalf of the Team – thank you Bob Hanson. Your Coaching is outstanding as well as your attention to detail in the machinations of Team Performance. I have not been coached in any sport by someone as passionate to the team as you, Bob!

It's pleasing to note that both Kelly Primmer and Lara Moses are double World Medallists.

Lara Moses also placed fifth in the Ocean Race Final, seventh in the Board Final and was a Team Member of Hughes, Sinclair and Primmer – to place fourth in the Rescue Tube Rescue.

I was honoured to be Touring Team Manager of our 2012 World Team.

The words I quoted and was subsequently published in *The Leader* article – Thursday, November 22, 2012 – best sums up how I felt: *"What inspired me was the camaraderie between all countries in particular Italy, Germany, Great Britain and the Malaysian Countries – however, best of all he said – "was the sportsmanship between our Bate Bay Athletes – it was inspirational and "Hats Off" to Wanda, for winning the World Youth competition – a great achievement!"*

In closing, I would like to thank our Youth Team Managers – Lou Moses and Jodee Calo – for their exceptional effort with the Competitors, accommodation and raising much needed funds to support the tour was truly awesome.

And to you – our Competitors, well done and thank you. You represented the *"Blue and Gold"* with pride and achieved fantastic results. We are all so very proud of you.
