# NSW SLS Pool Pool Rescue Championships – 29th July 2014

North Cronulla SLSC trained nine Athletes to compete in the 2014 NSW SLS Pool Rescue Championships, held at Woy Woy.

All were outstanding in their performances – gaining a State fifth position on the scoreboard – with 127 points.

North Cronulla secured 31 Medals: 13 Gold, 7 Silver and 11 Bronze.

# Dual Gold Medallists Australian Championships – Perth 2014

## *Under-19 Mixed 5-Person R & R – Open Womens 5-Person R & R*

### *A little bit of the history of the team . . .*

I have been coaching four of these girls since they were Nippers – winning their first State Title in Under-14s. Since then, they have performed consistently well in most Major Carnivals. They have been on the 2nd and 3rd Dais at Australian Titles in the past – each time standing alongside one of our other more Senior R & R Teams from North Cronulla. However that Australian Gold has narrowly eluded them for many years. These four girls therefore had unfinished business at the start of the season. However, things were looking grim as we were minus a Belt Swimmer. Despite desperate attempts to recruit one during the off-season, we were a man down.

Luckily, Kelly Primmer finally came to the aid of the party just at the right time and from then on the team never looked back. Kelly made a genuine commitment to the team and after a month, the Judges would never have known she hadn't been part of the team as long as the rest of the girls. She was our saviour and a great Belt Swimmer as well!

### *Aussies 2014 . . .*

Perth 2014 proved to be our Aussies. We really wanted to win that Under-19 Title, because we had finished second to Collaroy so many times, but Kelly had a really hard task of trying to beat an 18-year-old Male Swimmer. Just the difference in physical strength of a male – compared to a female at this age, makes this such a challenging job. But Kelly matched up against these Male Swimmers brilliantly! This combined with the precision of the other girls on the beach gave us our first *Australian Title* in Under-19 Mixed R & R. This was the last final to go into the water on the Saturday afternoon at Aussies.

The "Fremantle Doctor" was howling and the wait for results was agonising, but definitely worth the wait to hear our *North Cronulla Pink – 1st Place!*

Then on the Sunday morning, it was time for this team to back up for their second Australian Final in the Open Womens 5-Person R & R. North Cronulla had three teams in this final – NC Pink, NC Gold and NC Red.

This is a true indication of the depth of R & R in our Club. The girls went into the Final composed and determined to do their best, but never really expected to come away with another Gold Medal!

However, they did – just narrowly beating Angelsea (last year's Australian Gold Medallists) and Ben and Kristine's Teams – to take their second Australian Title in 24 hours! These wins are a testament to hard work, perseverance, commitment and focus! They are a great bunch of girls and a credit to their parents. Thank you to Jenny Hayes, for giving up her own time on the weekends, leading up to Aussies, to fine-tune the girls and also to Ben and Kristine, for all their tips they have given me in R & R since I began coaching six years ago.

Lastly, I would like to say that nominations are now open for an Under-19 Belt Swimmer and a First on Line.

Kelly will still be competing in Opens, but is too old for the Under-19s this coming season and Maddi, for some inexplicable reason, is going to the Boat Section.

It would be great if Hannah, Jade, and Chelsea could have the opportunity to compete one last time as Juniors before they have to go into Opens.

We would welcome male or female candidates – and if you are interested – we would love to hear from you ASAP.

"This is a reminder that the beach can be quite dangerous," he said. "If people are unsure of the condition of the water they can ask the surf lifesavers on patrol."

He said "no flags, no swim" was an easy way to remember that a beach was closed if flags were not displayed.

"Fortunately, the North Cronulla patrol had a fast response and no one was injured," he said.

Sunday's rescue is one of the first for the surf season, which started on Saturday.

More than 21,000 volunteer surf lifesavers will patrol beaches on weekends and public holidays until April 26 next year.

With last season's NSW coastal drowning toll at 27, Surf Life Saving NSW is urging beachgoers to swim only at patrolled locations in between the red and yellow flags.

## Man pulled from ocean rip

IT WAS a scenario that could easily have resulted in tragedy. A lone swimmer enters the surf at a closed beach and quickly finds himself in trouble after becoming caught in a rip.

Fortunately, the young man was spotted by surf lifeguards who rushed to his aid on Sunday afternoon.

It is a scene played out far too many times over the summer for those guarding our beaches.

Surf Life Saving NSW received almost 6000 people from the water across NSW in the past 12 months.

Of those rescues, 311 occurred in Sutherland Shire, with a further 281 calls made for first aid.

Sutherland Shire Council beach operations manager Brad Whitaker said the rescue team was only a short distance from the shore when he was caught in a rip running parallel to North Cronulla beach.

North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club volunteers pulled him from the water unaided.

Mr Whitaker said the rescue, only a day after the start of the surf patrol season, was a reminder for people to obey beach signs and swim between the flags.

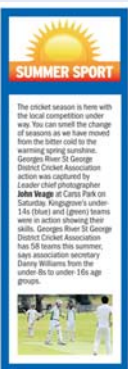

It is a non-tackling game. Normal dimensions of the field are 70 metres x 50 metres. Two fields will fit on one Rugby or Soccer field.

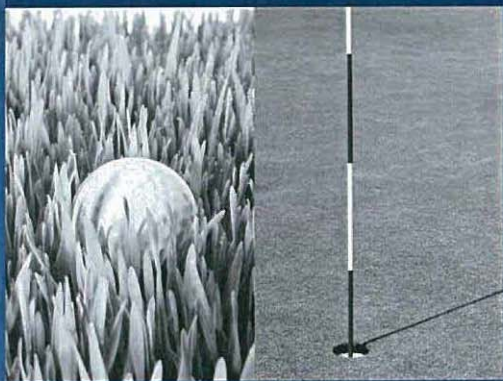
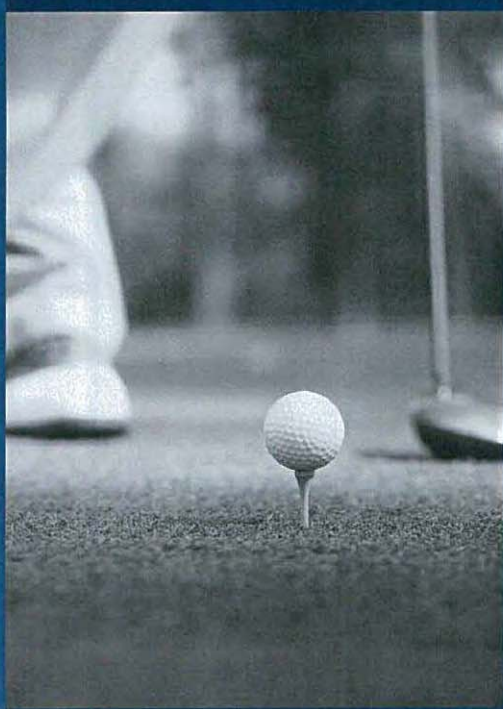

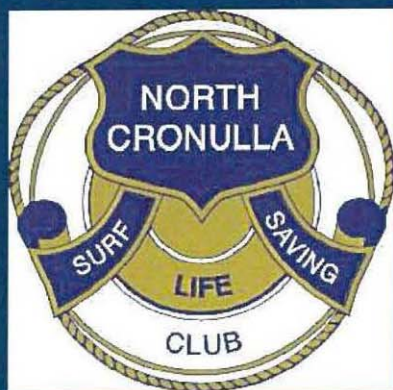

## Proficiency - Annual requirements

- 200m Run - 200m Swim - 200m Run in less than 8 minutes - NO WET SUITS
- Either a board or tube rescue
- Pass signals
- Deliver CPR on single and 2 persons for 2 minutes
- Practice in the use of oxygen and defibrillator
- NOTE: Generally dry land component will be conducted first in the ball room (to avoid sand and wet carpet) followed by the water component.
- **If people don't sign on they were never there!!!!!!**
- Please check weather and surf conditions prior as scheduled proficiencies can be cancelled if beach is closed or inclement weather.

A member's proficiency is valid until the **31<sup>st</sup> December each year** unless stated otherwise in Surfguard or via Circular (e.g. Apply (Senior) first Aid has a three year proficiency requirement). This Circular should be read in conjunction with Policy 5.4, where it is stated:

**"1.1 Members who are not proficient as at December 31<sup>st</sup> are not permitted to patrol, or compete in any SLSA competition, until they have obtained the required proficiency."**

This means that any member who is not proficient by the 31<sup>st</sup> December, or has not completed appropriate awards shall not be allowed to:

- Perform patrols
- Operate rescue craft or
- Compete in surf life saving competitions

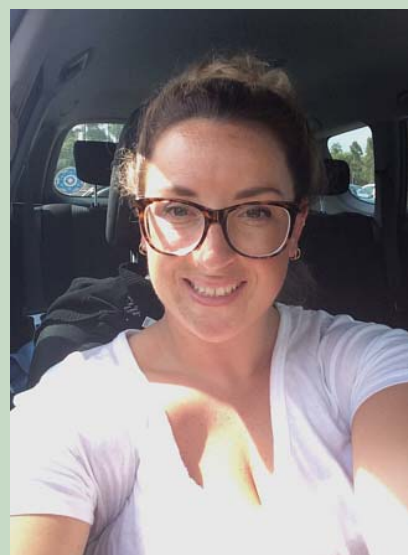

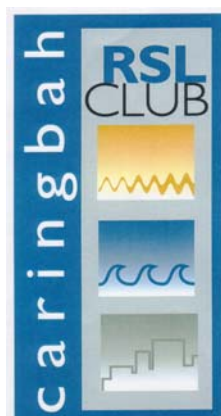
