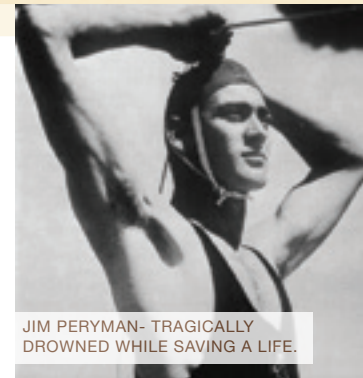

North Cronulla Celebrates 90 years

On the eve of the 90th anniversary of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club – and 50 years of club Nippers – and with the flags having come down on another surf season, there's a new appreciation of our lifesaving warriors.

Talking this week to the esteemed North Cronulla club patron and decorated life member, Warren Rennie, gave us an even stronger appreciation of surf lifesaving, both past and present.

True value

Not that I didn't already appreciate. But it dawned on us that the true value of these clubs lie not just with their own fine capabilities within, but what influence club and members alike have brought to bear on ordinary families.

"The number of family members who have joined their fathers and mothers, sons and daughters, sisters and brothers, in learning lifesaving techniques has been amazing," said the veteran Rennie, one of the stalwarts of surf lifesaving.

"And we keep hearing about them: non patrol members, saving lives, well away from the beach."

Much to be proud of

North Cronulla – indeed all four Bate Bay surf clubs – have much to be proud of. In keeping the beaches safe, saving lives, preventing tragedy and, collectively, passing on the latest lifesaving techniques to so many others.

Today's large heritage-listed, three-storey clubhouse under president Craig McKinnery plays host to 832 senior club members, both active patrol and non-active members, as well as 501 Nippers.

First patrol

The first patrol was on duty in December 1925 and consisted of a small team of volunteers armed with a reel, line and belt as their only rescue equipment, and they performed over 25 rescues in their first season of patrols.

The first North Cronulla clubhouse, a small weatherboard job, was erected in 1926 to the north of Cronulla SLSC (Wanda and Elouera didn't exist then).

But North Cronulla SLSC – which finished 11th and highest-placed of the four clubs at last week's national championships – could easily have faded from existence after World War II except for the determination of those early club members.

Early years

The early years and the Depression saw reasonably quiet seasons. But more members joined in the late 1930's and saw pressure for a new and bigger three-storey club, which was finally erected in 1937, followed by shark meshing and "1,000 feet of sea wall."

As detailed in the 50-year anniversary book "A shade of blue...a touch of gold", membership grew and within a year, the club organised their first carnival on January 15, 1938 under the guidance of a driving force in Jack Dillon, who with other members slept overnight in the club before erecting stands near the clubhouse.

Spectacular

It must rank as the most spectacular opening club carnivals in history, but for an entirely different reason.

An aerial display from pilot Harold Durant went horribly wrong. His small aerobatic light aircraft made a number of dives and loops around Bate Bay, but he aborted a final manoeuvre, stalled the plane and crashed into the shallow waters near the beach.

Lifesavers saw Durant step from the wreck, apparently uninjured (he was later seen drowning his sorrows at the old Hotel Sur Mer, Cronulla's first hotel). Members salvaged parts of the plane, and later charged a modest 2/- per person to view them in the boat shed.

Army constructions

The early part of World War 11 saw the Army undertake a number of defensive constructions around Bate Bay, including old tram rails supporting barbed wire and tank traps built into the sand in front of the stepped walls and the North Cronulla clubhouse.

It proved to be the club's undoing.

By October 1942, seas and erosion had resulted in 23-metres of the wall collapsing.

Worse was to come three years later when the clubhouse was directly threatened when tons of sand disappeared and the concrete paving in front of the club washed away, resulting in the club hanging over a sheer drop ...

Collapse under big seas

A new sea wall was built, but a year later (1946) it started to collapse under big seas, resulting in widening cracks in the clubhouse itself.

News of the club's obvious demise spread far and wide, and attracted 18,000 cars to North Cronulla from the city and suburbs, before the club kiosk and pavilion collapsed and plummeted the building into the surf below.

The remainder of the club was demolished and the council erected an Armco hut as a temporary replacement in Dunningham Park. It was around the same time members, including returned servicemen, marched north up the beach to form a new club – Wanda SLSC.

It took three years before the new multi-storey North Cronulla club was built and opened in front of a big crowd, on November 18, 1950.

Tragic death

Warren Rennie reminds that it was the tragic death of their popular club captain Major James (Jim) Peryman in the same year (1950) which really galvanised the club's focus on surf lifesaving.

Peryman, wearing a belt, played a major role in the rescue of a 16-year-old girl in The Alley, but not before he perished

himself in the big seas. His body was found under water, his line and belt entangled in seaweed – and all attempts to resuscitate failed.

"After his death they created a safety release pin, so a beltman could, at any time, pull the pin to release himself," explained Rennie. "Unfortunately his brother died 10 years later, on the same day, in a motor accident."

Remembered

Jim Peryman's death saw a fund of 2,000 pounds raised, with an ambulance room and a radio communications room furnished and decorated in his memory. His picture adorns the club's stairway, and the club's pool carries his name – the James Peryman memorial pool.

The same year, 1968, North Cronulla staged its first Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships on a beach nearby, which was later to become Elouera beach. In 1974 the first-ever Taplin Relay was won by North Cronulla (they also won the second) and two years later, the club won the Australian Championships Pointscore.

In 1981, the same year women were eligible to become active lifesavers across the movement, North Cronulla club won its first world championships (and won it again in 1994).

Great administrators

Great administrators, officials and clubmen like former president Harry Brown, Harold Judd, Jim Peryman, Warren Rennie and Norm Rees were complimented by champion competitors like Hall of Fame board paddler Steve Warren and surfboat sweep, Steve Swane, and their respective teams.

Now, the club's competition division is on the up and the club is thriving under the capable hands of men and women including club president Craig McKinnery and his wife Tracey, the club secretary and their strong committee.

"From a very small and humble start, we developed into one of the best surf clubs in Australia," said Mr McKinnery.

Nippers Chair Donna Hargreaves and her organising committee, Julie McKinnery, Scott Young, Carmel Lewis, Maurie Tattl, Kevin Macnamara and Steven Brown worked tirelessly and keynote speakers Steve Warren, Jamie Primmer and Ray Wilkinson captured the spirit of the day perfectly.

However, the highlight of the night had to be the reunion of the club and the world's first ever nipper squad. No names mentioned but the guys have photo's and memories that will last them for the rest of their lives.

100 Years of Lifesavers Service to the Armed Forces

“Part of the pre-condition of being a lifesaver is a series of sense of community and serving others so it is not surprising that those who start out in the surf lifesaving movement should be represented in higher numbers among soldiery.

In war time we celebrate mateship; for me there’s a higher calling and you see it in surf lifesaving where you actually save people you’ve never met, you risk your life for people you’ve never met. I think that’s a wonderfully admirable thing.

I’m interested in commemorating, not celebrating, the sacrifice made by Australian’s in war time. Australia is made up of a rich mosaic of different communities and as we mark the centenary period of Anzac, it is terrific that separate communities remember their own who fell, while all of Australia remembers all that fell.”

History of Surf Life Saving

In 1902 it was against the law to enter the ocean during daylight hours in Australia. William Gocher, a Sydney newspaper editor, announced a challenge of this law at Manly Beach and, eventually, the legislation was changed. However, as inexperienced swimmers were having problems with unusual surf conditions such as rip currents, the number of drownings dramatically increased. Groups of volunteers began to patrol the beach to assist the swimmers and in 1906 the Bondi Beach Association was formed.

The Surf Bathing Association of New South Wales was later formed on 18th October 1907 when nine voluntary surf lifesaving clubs and representatives of the Royal Life Saving Society (RLSS) met and affiliated to represent the interests of surf lifesavers. At that meeting it was resolved: “That it is desirable to form an association of surf clubs, to secure improved facilities for surf bathing, and otherwise promote and regulate the sport” and “That the association be called The Surf Bathing Association of NSW.”



The name was changed to Surf Lifesaving Association of Australia (SLSAA) in 1922. In 1991 this name changed to the current Surf Life Saving Australia.

Historically, the Australian lifesaver is portrayed as a national symbol and an image of manhood. For more than 80 years, there was a viewpoint that women did not belong on beaches, instead being supportive fundraisers and social organisers. Almost immediately, many women refused to be confined to these roles; they participated in their own competitions, were proficient in rescue techniques and were proud to belong to the movement, contradicting the widely shared beliefs that their active involvement began only in 1980 when they were officially granted full membership.

The enlistment of many club members into the armed forces during the First World War heightened the status of the surf lifesaver as an Australian icon.

Unfortunately some clubs suffered heavy casualties. The Honour Boards in Club rooms around the country commemorate those who lost their lives at war.

The presence of surf lifesavers in the Australian armed forces was also felt in World War 2 which not only diminished their presence on Australian beaches, but made surf lifesaving on overseas beaches part of the war experience for many. Surf lifesavers patrolled beaches in war zones, set up new clubs in places like Torokina Beach in the Solomon Islands, Jaffa, Syria, and Papua New Guinea and Cornwall. World War 2 also saw the training of hundreds of American soldiers in Australian surf lifesaving methods on Queensland’s beaches.

One North Cronulla Member worth acknowledging is Blair Anderson Wark (1894-1941), Victoria Cross and Distinguished Service Order. Vice President of North Cronulla SLSC as recorded in the 1939-40 Annual Report.



- 1915 – Appointed to Australian Imperial Force.
- 1916 – Embarked to Egypt and then to the Western Front.
- 1918 – Earned the Victoria Cross for extraordinary bravery during operations against the Hindenburg Line.
- 1941 – Returned to active service during World War 2 at Victoria’s Puckapunyal Army Base.

Major Wark passed away suddenly aged 46 of coronary heart disease.

The Mateship Trek 2015

The Mateship Trek was founded in 2008 by the Labor Member for Blaxland, **Jason Clare** and the Liberal Member for Cook, **Scott Morrison**. The Treks are designed to unite young Australians from different backgrounds to

- honour the sacrifices of our diggers and carry forward those stories;
- invest in realizing their potential to live a life worthy of our diggers’ sacrifice;
- celebrate their differences and what they have in common; and
- raise funds to support our modern day diggers.

The first Trek to Kokoda in 2009 brought together surf life savers from the Shire and young people of ethnic Lebanese Muslim background, following the conflict that occurred in Southern Sydney in 2005.

The second Trek in 2011, retraced the Sandakan Death March to Ranau, where Australia suffered its worst ever military atrocity.

The third Mateship Trek, between Wau and Salamaua, followed the Black Cat Track, in Northern Papua New Guinea. The 2015 Mateship Trek retraced the steps of the Gallipoli soldiers and remembered them at a joint Australian/Turkish memorial service on Australia Day. In the year of the Centenary of Anzac, the Mateship Trek was very proud to be supporting Soldier On.

North Cronulla’s representative on the 2015 Mateship Trek was Joel Eaton.

Celebrating 100 Years of Surf Sports

In 2015 the movement celebrated a significant milestone – the centenary of the founding of Surf Sport competition.

In 1915 the first NSW Surf Life Saving Championships was held at Bondi Beach. This was the event that was a forerunner of the Australian Championships. Just two events were given championship status in the inaugural year with Bondi taking out the Senior R&R event and J.G Brown, also from Bondi, taking winning the Open Surf Race. In 2015 400 separate events and 7000 competitors battled out at the NSW Championships.

To win a state title, which were known as the Association Championships during the 1920's and 30's, was to be by default, the National Champion. Interstate competitors entered the NSW Championships, recognising it was the best place to develop their skills as lifesavers and athletes. The event was seen as a great way to round-off the season, and was held every year apart from a brief hiatus during the First and Second World Wars.

Due to a desire for the movement to take on a more national focus it became essential for the State Championships to be run as a separate event. In March 1950 the NSW Championships were contested in North Wollongong, the first major event to be held outside the Sydney Metropolitan area.

- Since 1950 NSW Championship hosting duties have been shared around the clubs. The sheer scale of the event today means that not all beaches are suitable to host the championships.
- The first 2-day NSW Championships took place during the 1964/65 season at Coogee.
- In the mid-80's women's events were formally added to the NSW Championships.
- In 1982/83 the competition was extended to a three-day format.

- In the late 90's the NSW Junior Championships were incorporated into the main State Titles.
- Sydney Branch last hosted the NSW Championships during the 2006/07 season.
- The Aussies is the largest event of its kind in the world. Not only is it an elite sporting event, but it is also a celebration of Australia's culture and passion for surf lifesaving.
- The Australian Titles were started as a way of Surf Lifesavers to train and compete in skills that would enable them in a rescue situation.
- In the early days of competition The Aussies were solely held around the Sydney area. In the post-World War 2 years the carnival finally moved interstate with its first out of NSW competition being held in the Gold Coast in 1947. This was an enormous opportunity for SLS members and was significant to the development and modernisation of the sport.
- In 1937 until 1979 The Aussies hosted a Pillow Fight Event.
- The only time the Aussies haven't been held since 1915 was between 1941 and 1945 when the Second World War was occurring.
- 1975 was the first time IRB's were used in an Australian Championships to set out buoys. Legend has it that the buoys were first taken out to sea in a surf boat but were dropped a bit too far so Harry Brown assisted in the movement of the cans without hesitation.
- 1982 at the 75th Anniversary dinner Steve Warren was recognised as one of the most successful Australian Championship competitors ever along with Ken Lacey and Ken Vidler.
- Prior to three women's events being added to The Aussies carnival women used to compete with the men in the Surf Ski, Ironman, Boat Races and IRB Races.

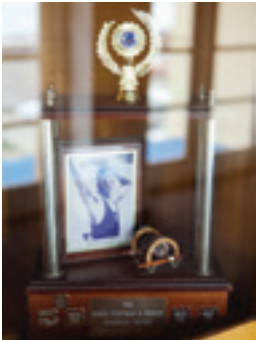

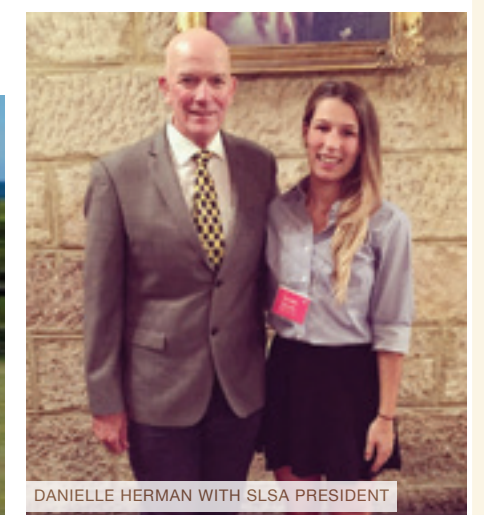

This season was a very big year for North Cronulla SLSC across all aspects of club life and our key functional areas and we are building and gaining momentum each season.

Some of the highlights and milestones included:

- Our Nippers celebrated 50 years of providing lifesaving, training and education, competition and life skills to thousands of young children who progress through our Nipper racks;
- Harry Brown Room – Stage 1 upgrade and refurbishment completed
- 90th Anniversary Celebration of North Cronulla SLSC – Founded in 1925 and still going strong;
- Draft and modern constitution before the Board of Directors for review and adoption;

- North Cronulla Christmas Carnival now in 35th season, Winner of inaugural Steve Warren Cup;

Our "Nippers" members are the future life savers and leaders of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club and under the leadership of Donna Hargreaves and the Junior Activities Committee they are in very capable hands. The Nipper section works across all areas of our CMP and each weekend the Squad Leaders work on a structured program to develop self-esteem, team work, water and surf safety skills and learn lifesaving and competition skills. Our results at surf carnivals, number of training and education awards gained, very high quality of our Nipper members including this year's Nipper Club Captains, all combine to confirm this section is working well and our challenge is to ensure we continue the level of engagement via a structured program when they move into the senior section of the Club.

I am very excited that our Youth Development Director Monika di Maio has developed and is launching a North Cronulla Youth Engagement Program to help with the transition of our Nippers into the senior section of the Club. There are several aims of the program and these include engagement with our younger members and explain the pathways open to them within the surf lifesaving movement, improve the retention rate of our members aged 13 to 18 years of age, encourage continuous develop of our young members, promote participation and

commitment within the surf club and reinforce their value as respected members and citizens within the local community. The program has been approved by our Board of Directors and will be launched for next season.

To our Junior and Senior carnival officials and water safety personal, thank you for your support and dedication to your respective duties and events throughout the season. You are a very vital and critical area of our surf club operations and we need to develop and increase our number of officials each season

Life Saving & Patrols

Gavan Duffy, our Life Saving Director, Club Captain Jamie Primer, Club Vice Captain Kane Hughes and the Lifesaving team introduced some refreshing changes to Patrol structures and rosters with the aim to build Patrol Teams with sense and purpose to improve the ability of the patrols to meet the day to day challenges of providing volunteer life-saving patrols and beach management at North Cronulla SSLC.

The members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club recorded the following activities during patrol season:

- Performed over 14,000 Volunteer patrols hours across 12 rostered patrols;
- Recorded 91 Rescues;
- Involved in over 3000 Preventative Actions;
- 132 First Aid cases;

The number of recorded Rescues is higher than the 3 year average due to a large number of rescues performed over the Australia Day weekend. Preventative Actions are up on the 3 year average and this was due to improved patrol and beach management skills.

This season we had 13 members who performed more than 100 hours of volunteer patrol duties and two outstanding Club members – Steve Cardy and Allan Freeman achieved over 150 hours of patrol on our beach. Overall this highlights the dedication of our members to their core duty which is surf lifesaving and performing patrols.

One of the highest awards in Surf Lifesaving is the Gold Medallion and this season we have two extra members who gained that award – Congratulations Alex Budd and Kelly Primmer

The seasons efforts were recognised at the annual SLS Sydney Awards of Excellence with members of North Cronulla members awarded the following:

BJD Female Life Saver of the Year – Emily Maythers;

Under 15 Life Saver of the Year – Maddison Moyle;

Under 17 Life Saver of the Year – Shannon Glasson High Commendation;

Nomination for Rescue of the Month for January 2015.

Two long serving members were awarded their 10 years 100% Patrol Attendance awards with a new Club blazer and a third celebrated 20 years of 100% Patrol attendance at our Blue & Gold Gala Presentation Night.

Congratulations to Linda Hawkins and Martin Fulton on a wonderful achievement of 10 years 100% Patrol Attendance and Darren Thorne on 20 years of outstanding volunteer lifesaving service to North Cronulla SLSC.

Training & Education

Our Training and Education team was under the leadership and guidance of Jason Gallon our Director of Training and Education (CTO) and achieved the following:

- 55 Surf Rescue Certificates – Our future lifesavers
- 32 Bronze Medallions

- 5 Silver Medallion Beach Management

- 7 Advanced Resuscitation Certificates
- 5 Spinal Management
- New qualified training officers & Assessors across the award structure.

This gave us a total of 544 awards including our Nipper Surf Education Awards and that was a slight increase on the previous season.

This effort was rewarded at the annual SLS Sydney Awards of Excellence, Jason Gallon recognised with a High Commendation for Assesor of the Year.

Another highlight was our club members branching out into other SLSA programs.

- Emily Maythers attended the Junior Life Saver of the Year Development camp;

Another successful North Cronulla SLSC Iron Person Classic was organised by our Nipper section and held on Australia Day 2015. Unfortunately the weather and surf conditions were poor and after the first event held at North Cronulla beach, a decision was made to transfer the event down to Cronulla beach for safety reasons. Appreciation and thanks extended to Cronulla SLSC and members for your support on the day.

Administration and Finance

This section of the Club is vital to the success of all other areas of the club operation and is once again successfully managed by Tracey McKinnery our Club Secretary and Ben Smollett who is the Finance Director.

Most of the work is in the background and is completed without any fanfare or publicity but they have to produce reports, manage financial accounts, deliver on the objectives of the club management plan, arrange sponsors events and Blue & Gold Gala presentation night, deliver our annual report and audited financial statements, manage our governance and statutory financial responsibilities, generate meeting agendas and minutes, attend Executive and Board of Director meetings on a regular cycle and the smooth delivery of these tasks is critical to overall performance of the Club.

Project Phoenix has moved several steps further along the development application process. We held a Special General meeting in November 2014 with the membership voting to proceed based on the motions voted for. The Club has presented the Master Concept Plans and overall development concept to a Sutherland Shire Council meeting and as an outcome of that meeting a Working Party was formed between the club and Council. A Pre DA meeting has been held and then we will move to a meeting with an architect panel to review concept plans. The Council is currently considering a combined approach for the construction work planned for precinct with a proposed new North Cronulla Sea Wall, upgrade works to Dunningham Park and North Cronulla SLSC redevelopment amalgamated into a single Plan of Management and this will be debated at a future Council meeting. Our next step and direction will be dependent upon the outcomes and resolutions of that important council meeting.

Harry Brown Room Stage 1 refurbishment was completed this season and the room is fully operational and held many functions including our very successful Nipper 50th Celebrations in October 2014 and our 90th Anniversary Celebrations over

the first weekend of May 2015. The second stage of the project is under review with Sutherland Shire Council and plan to complete this year subject to addressing any planning issues with council. Once again we extend our gratitude and thanks to NSW Premier, NSW Government, Department of Sport and Recreation and SLS NSW for this grant under the 2013-2014 Surf Club Facility Development Grant Program.

To our Sponsors once again thank you for your continued support and it is greatly appreciated. The ability to successfully provide services and equipment for competition, training and education, lifesaving and patrol duties is a key responsibility of the Club and is achievable with your generous support each season. We have several very long term sponsors who have once again committed to the Club and these include Carlton United Breweries, The Caringbah, Coca Cola Amatil, Toll Express, Caltex and Tradies. New major sponsors this year included Channel Nine News and Canterbury Leagues and we welcome them to North Cronulla.

Finance Director's Report

AS FINANCE DIRECTOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS I AM PROUD TO PRESENT THE 2015 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS.



The financial statements show a profit of \$78,827 for the year (2014 \$41,506).

This excellent result reflects the hard work of all members of the club though consideration should be given to the timing difference of the proceeds from the government grant of \$49,736 included in

full as income in the 2015 financial year however the funds were spent on capital improvement for the upgrade of the ball room. These costs will be depreciated over the life of the asset.

Cash generated from operating activities during this financial year of \$178,942 (2014 \$121,571) was invested in capital equipment for lifesaving, clubhouse assets and competition to value of \$81,728, resulting in an increase in cash held of \$99,259.

Further I would like to note that the club also holds and invests funds in trust on behalf of the Tom Payne Foundation which at the end of the financial year valued \$88,454.

Our strong financial position allows our club to pursue development opportunities including the proposed gear shed redevelopment. We will need to continue to control operational spending as the club will incur significant costs preparing for and investing in appropriate due diligence on the gear shed development project.

Thank you again to the office administration team of Sheridan, Glenn-Marie and Melissa who have once again been a great help throughout the season.

I believe the board and I have again provided a financially responsible set of financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2015 and I look forward to contributing to a positive and successful 2016 year.

"A Season to Celebrate and Remember"

Over the course of the past season we celebrated our 90th Anniversary, 50 years of Nippers, 100 Years of Surf Sports and 100 Years of Service to the Armed Forces. These moments were celebrated with Anniversary functions, The Bate Bay Ball, Formal Services and Surf Carnivals. We have continued our service to the community with 14 000 hours of patrols and "no lives lost". Welcomed new lifesavers with 55 SRC certificates and 32 Bronze Medallions. The North Cronulla Surf lifesaving patrols are proactive in their attention to prevention of injury and accident as is one of the main reason for the continuing success of the patrols at North Cronulla.

This year I would like to make a special thankyou to Beth Fulton who is retiring from her role as one of our longest serving Patrol Captains, and on behalf of North Cronulla Surf Club, we thank her for her outstanding service. Beth's patrol will be taken over by Jason Gollan who has a wealth of experience as our training and Education Director and will now also be a Patrol Captain.

This season we have seen our numbers grow from our junior cadet members who are enjoying their first seasons as patrolling members and enjoying making friends and spending their patrol hours on the beach having a good time with their friends as well as fulfilling their rostered obligations.

In this season North Cronulla put through 55 SRC, 32 Bronze Medallions, 5 Silver Medallions, 29 IRB Crew and 9 IRB Drivers.

During the 2014 – 2014 season, we also made changes to the way the patrols are rostered to a team based system, where a focus was put on members patrolling with their mates and selection of services from within the patrols with the aim of increasing our retention of patrolling members each year. Feedback on these basic changes was that it was an overwhelming success, but as always when initiatives are introduced, there are always areas of improvement that can still be made.

Looking forward to the 2015 – 2016 Patrol Season, we always seek to improve patrolling conditions for our members, and we understand that being a patroller at the beach can conflict with work, family and competition pressure for each person.

For 2015 – 2016 we will look to increase our patrols to 14 patrols to cut down the No. of individual hours each person must spend on the beach. Also, we will look at implementing a greater degree of flexibility in patrolling hours within the patrol. Lastly, we will be trialling a new substitute process which will automatically update on surfguard which we expect to be trialled in the 2015 – 2016 season.

However, we can only go to 14 patrols if we have enough services that can be provided to sustain 14 individual patrols. Accordingly, we do need people to do additional courses to fill important roles in the club and patrol roster. The roles add value to our younger members skill sets and also look good on the employment resumes, and this year is no exception, we need people to fill roles as IRB drivers, Advances Resuscitation and Spinal injury management for our upcoming 2015 – 2016 season.

The inclusion of the Australian Youth Surf Life Saving Championships for U/14 and U/15s was embraced well by the competitors of North Cronulla and turned out to be an amazing experience for all involved.

We were pleased to see some incredible and encouraging results on the beach throughout the 2014/15 season.

The participation by competitors of all levels and the positive teamwork was great to see, with true North Cronulla spirit on show at many carnivals.

Leading the way once again was Oliver Hoare with Gold in the U19 2km beach run at Aussies, State and Branch. He also backed this up at Aussies with an 8th in the Open 2km beach run and at State winning Gold in the Open 2km beach run.

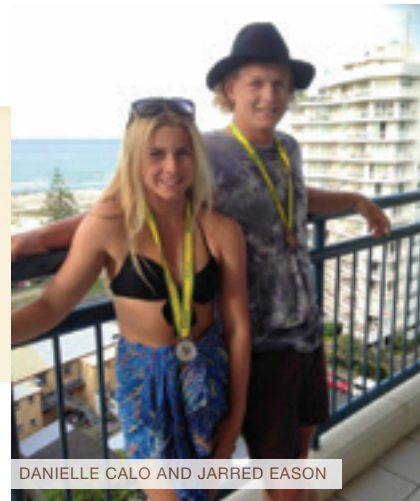

Unfortunately the surf conditions prevented our masters water team from competing at branch which left Gladys Honer as our only competitor. Gladys was able to continue her winning streak from 2014 at branch medalling in the sprint and flags for her age group.

At state this year North Cronulla was represented by a small but successful contingent of competitors. Stephen Warren once again proved his superiority as a board paddler winning his age group in the board race and backing up to win a silver in the Iron man. Warren Lobb was also 3rd in this same board race. Steve also teamed up with Stewart Cameron in the board rescue to claim another gold medal and then partnered Warren Lobb in the double ski claiming bronze. Shane Whittaker also won an individual gold in his Iron man event and finished 4th in the rescue tube and 6th in the surf race. In total we had 4 individual water competitors who won 5 medals. Gladys was our only Beach competitor this year and was happy to come away with a bronze in the flags and a 4th in the 1 km beach run. North Cronulla had 2 masters boat crews competing at State with the 180+ vets crew of Michael Bofinger, David Gregson, Vaughn Meldrum, Wayne Turner and Trevor Robson (sweep) winning gold and the 200+ Koros crew of Adam Purdie, Barry Schuettrumpf, Michael Spurr, Geoff Streater and Steve Swaine (sweep) finishing 5th. Both crews were up against a large number of strong entries from many NSW clubs so to make finals in masters boats you need to be extremely competitive.

At Aussies this year Steve Warren showed that retirement definitely agreed with him when he took out the Australian board race title for his age group. I've actually lost count of the times he has now won this event and it is no wonder he is referred to as a legend in Surf Lifesaving. Our results only tell part of our great success story. We have a strong "TEAM". Everyone is committed to their training and



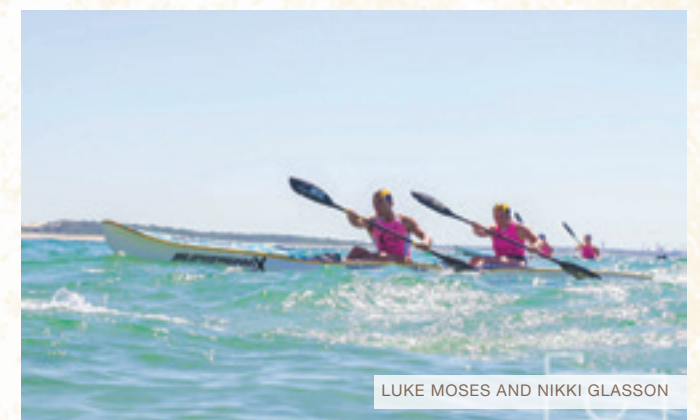

Surfboat Section Report

THE 2014 /2015 SURF LIFE SAVING SEASON HAS BEEN A VERY BUSY AND REWARDING ONE FOR THE NORTH CRONULLA BOAT SECTION.

Our goal was to continue to encourage and guide the youth of our section to form a solid future and to develop the talent we possessed by providing expertise and up to date equipment. Craft is always a focus and fundraising continued throughout the season but more importantly the bonds and friendships that have been formed this season have taken the morale in our section to a new level.

Ten open crews (including three Junior Crews) and two Masters Crews started the season with determination. Eight crews entered the highly competitive South Coast Series where North Cronulla achieved a creditable third behind Austinmer and Bulli, two great rowing clubs. Purds' Reserve Crew entered the Ocean Thunder which gave Lockie and Kurt Spurr some great experience rowing with Clarky and Guru against the best crews in Australia. Trax's A's filled in for one day and made the final. A special thank you must also go to Lockie Spurr who displayed a true sense of team work throughout the entire season by filling in for many crews from Juniors to A's!!

All our crews have been competitive and results across all carnivals were very encouraging. Our strength as a section started to show at the interclub when we took ownership of the 'Boat Trophy' once again.

Nine Open Crews and Two Masters rowed at the NSW State Championships in extremely testing conditions. Four crews made the finals: Trax's A's (6th) Colts (3rd), Yappy's Junior's (3rd) and Trax's Reserve's/ 180 Vet's (6th in Reserves and 1st in 180s.)

In April at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships at Tugun Beach in Queensland, Eight Open Crews and three Masters Crews represented North Cronulla. Two crews made the finals: Colts (3rd) and Juniors (4th). Purd's Junior Crew made the major semi-final in their first year of rowing only to miss out by the slightest of margins. To have two Junior Crews in the top eight in Australia is simply outstanding and a first for North Cronulla. Trax's Vets made it into the Australian Top 12 in Reserves and two Masters crews won medals in the Masters competition: - Vets 160's won silver, 180's won Gold and brought home the Inaugural Aussies '180' Boat trophy. The 200's rowed brilliantly to come in 4th. Together North Cronulla was the third best performing Boat section at the 2015 Aussie Championships.

As a club and as a section we have many people who help us to function competitively. Countless people give up their time and many support us through sponsorship. 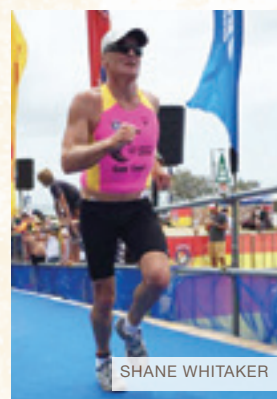

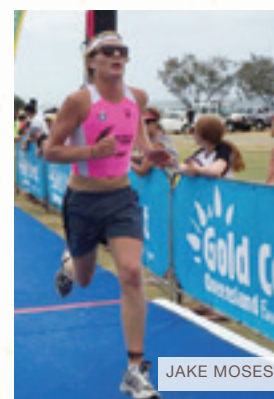

This year, North Cronulla had its 90th Anniversary, with the club beginning back in 1925. Every patrol we go roving down the beach, or take watch from the patrol tower. When we take our breaks, we jump in the surf for a swim, paddle boards or get hot chips. Surf life saving is something that is fun, educational and extremely rewarding in the event a life is saved.

Can you believe the Surf Life Saving Gods were not smiling upon us again for the 3rd year straight at the Age State Championships at Umina? Despite the huge surf, the waiting, and the long treks up and down the beach, we still had a great time. Congratulations to all the medal winners and to everyone who participated and gave it their best shot. A special mention to the Under 14 boys, fantastic result placing in the top 5 for every event they participated in. This success in part can be attributed to our early training as young nippers and being taken to the cans and out of our comfort zone by one crazy squad leader...

The highlight of my year was definitely the Under 14's Queensland Trip. It was a great way of bringing the group closer together. This is the event everyone should look forward to towards the end of their nipper experience. I'd like to thank everyone who helped with fundraising for that event, particularly Carmel Lewis, and the chaperones that went along with us. Fun was had by everyone with the expected



frivolity initiated by the usual suspects. No harm done and no limbs lost, except for the mannequin's (those on tour will understand).

I'd like to thank all the squad leaders, parents, coaches and people behind the scenes. Without you, nippers just wouldn't be the same. The hard work you have done for North Cronulla is fantastic and greatly appreciated.

To the nippers, I hope you have made lifelong friends, learned to take responsibility and most importantly, learned to save lives. You are the future lifesavers of North Cronulla.

Finally, to Elizabeth Smith, Jack Vrazalica, Daisy Waugh and Michael DeFrancesco, as next season's junior club captains and vice captains, I wish you the best on your journey. Take good care of the club and the nippers.

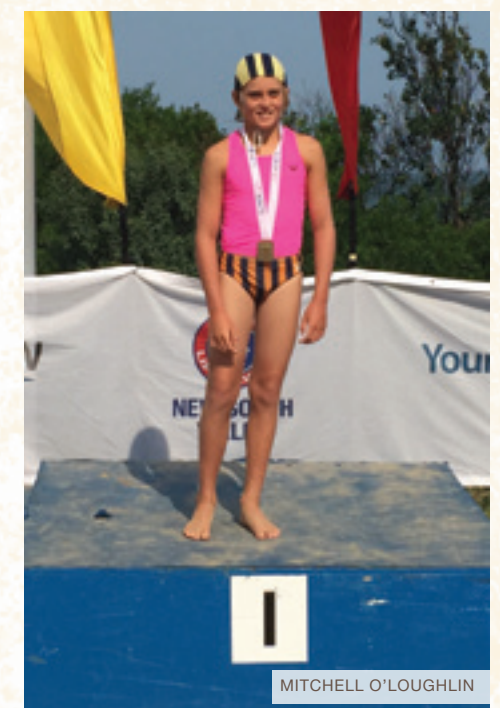

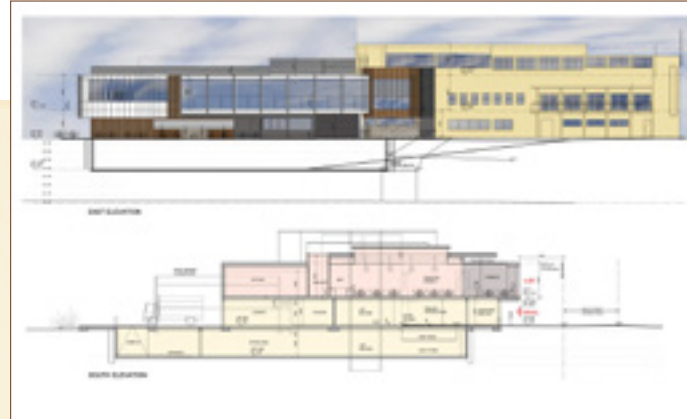

Project Phoenix

NORTH CRONULLA SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC. GEAR COMPLEX REDEVELOPMENT. (REDEVELOPMENT OF EXISTING CLUB GEAR COMPLEX, CLUB AND COUNCIL FACILITIES AND CAFÉ)



The proposed redevelopment of North Cronulla SLSC gear complex, club and council facilities and existing café has been around for many years and gone through several different designs, proposals and ideas without any real success or progress of construction activities.

The current gear complex is now running at capacity and there are issues with the safe storage of existing club and council life-saving equipment and competition equipment for all sections of the club. As the club continues to grow and expand our passive and active storage requirements, we need provide updated facilities for male and female club members and provide new and updated facilities to perform training and education of our club members, these cannot be provided in the existing three story surf club building and therefore the redevelopment of the gear complex is critical for the club to accommodate these changes and allow the Club to grow and develop over the next 50 to 100 years.

The redevelopment will have allowance for commercial floor space that will provide the club with a revenue stream based on the consent conditions outlined and approved in Sutherland Shire Council - North Cronulla SLSC Management Plan. This revenue stream will be critical to the future and ongoing development of the Club and will provide Club Board of Directors with the ability to provide funds to help fund our commitment to our members and the community to provide equipment for Life Saving and Patrols on North Cronulla beach, competition equipment and training and education equipment and facilities for our members.

Last year the Board of Directors approved the engagement of Bergstrom Architects for the development of a Master Concept Plan for the redevelopment. These plans are finalized, approved and have been used in all correspondence with the Club and Sutherland Shire Council and will form the base for any work associated with moving the project through various phases to approved Development Application stage.

In September 2014, the Assistant Minister for Infrastructure, the Hon Jamie Briggs approved the funding of up to \$100,000 ex GST under the Community Development Grants program to the North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club – Upgrade of facilities project (Project Phoenix). These funds are to be used for Project Phoenix: North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Inc. Gear Complex Redevelopment (Redevelopment of existing club gear complex, club and council facilities and café) Planning Phase as per the terms and conditions of the funding agreement and associated schedules.

A Special General Meeting was held on Sunday 9th November 2014 and two motions were voted upon our membership and approval was granted to continue with the development process. These motions approved the overall development project and the expenditure of funds for the engagement of suitable qualified professional organisations for the planning, design, creation of Development Application and a Construction Certificate required to bring Project Phoenix (Redevelopment of existing club gear complex, club and council facilities and café) to an approved development stage as per Sutherland Shire Council development application process or associated process if referred to NSW Government Joint Regional Planning Panel.

Sutherland Shire Council has engaged external companies to perform a Building Code of Australia Compliance Assessment Report and DDA Audit report on the surf club buildings and also a building condition report. These have highlighted major issues with the condition of the existing buildings and estimated costs of \$1.2 Million to make the building code complaint and address major maintenance and building faults. Over the May and June months, the Council has been working on making repairs and painting the internal walls, windows and door of the surf club and we are very appreciative of these work activities.

In January 2015, a presentation was made by Club members to the Sutherland Shire Council Special Infrastructure Project and Work Committee to outline our Club history, Project Phoenix overview, financial update, review master concept plans and outline council support required for the project and questions and answer session at end of the meeting.

An outcome of the meeting was the establishment of a Council Working Party and the first meeting was held in February 2015 and representatives from Council, Councilors and Club members and worked through a set agenda and tour of the club and proposed area of development. Several action items were discussed at the meeting and these were adopted at the next meeting of the Council.

A Pre Application Development (PAD) meeting was held in March 2015 and report supplied to the Club and we will engage with suitable qualified professionals to discuss and resolve the items listed in the report. Another outcome of this report was a recommendation to meet for a pre DA ARAP (Architectural Review Advisory Panel) and that meeting will be arranged shortly.

Another item raised at the PAD meeting was the influence of our construction zone on the proposed North Cronulla Sea Wall and that will require further investigation from Council



officers and reported back to Council for review. A report has been supplied to Sutherland Shire Council for review and consideration with one of the main objectives is to combine the three projects of North Cronulla SLSC Project Phoenix, North Cronulla Sea Wall construction and Dunningham Park Upgrade into a single Plan of Management for the precinct. At time of



writing this report the Council had not held the Council meeting considered the report and recommendations contained.

The project is progressing and moving forward and is critical to the future of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club and our current and future members – There is no second place here, it must be delivered!

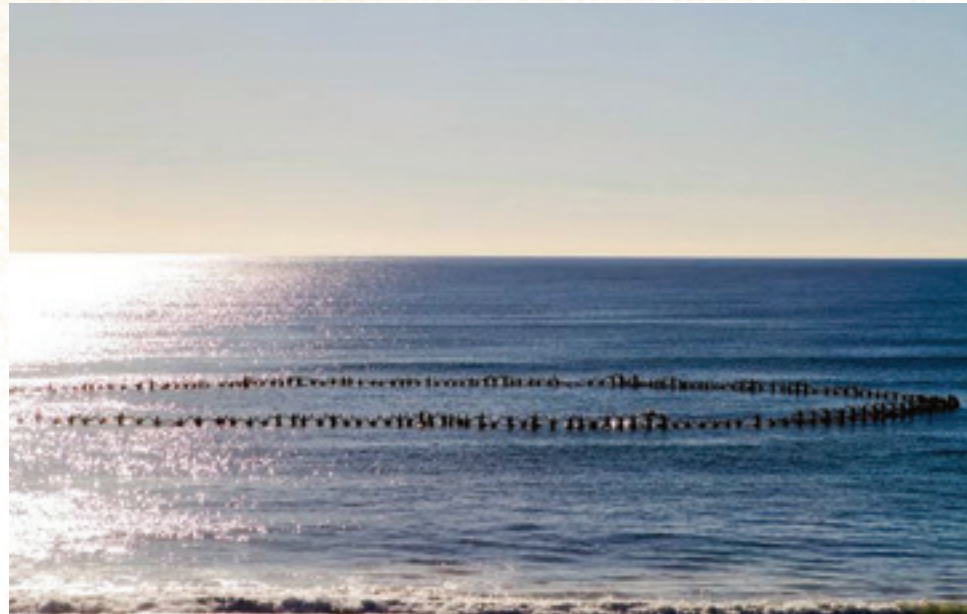
Vales

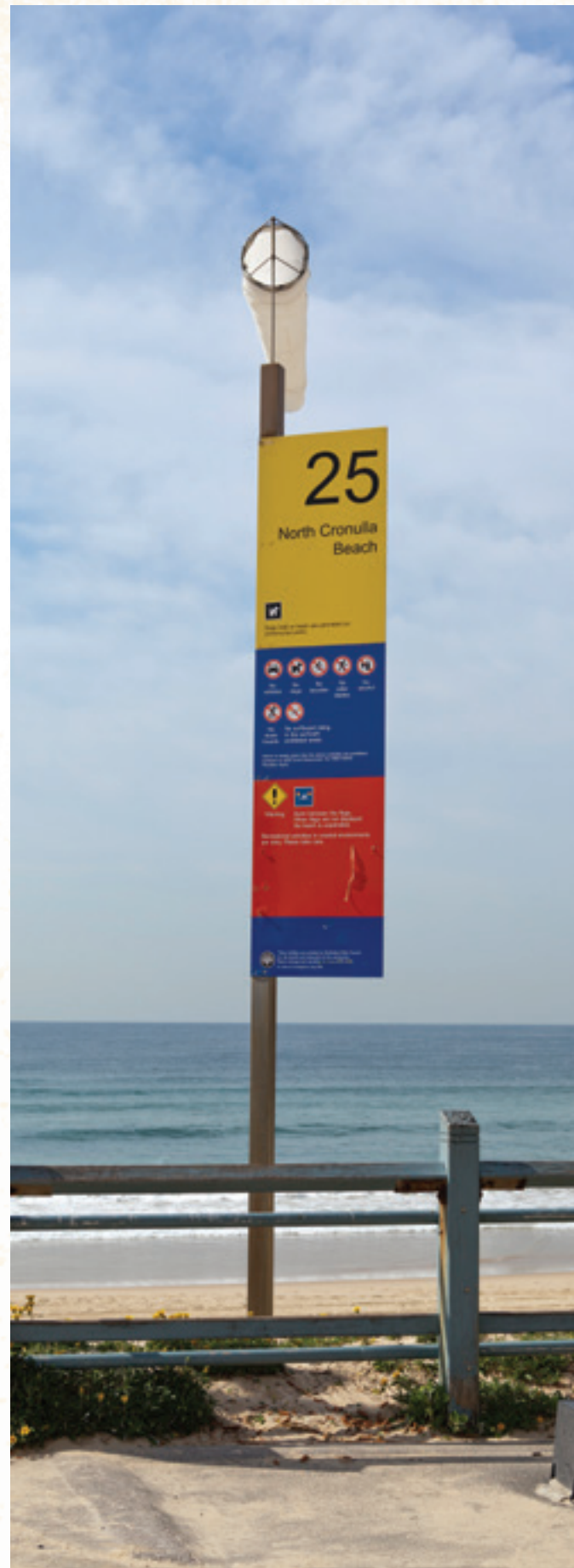



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

In the officers' opinion, the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purposes of complying with the New South Wales legislation the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The officers have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of North Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1031 'Materiality', AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' and AASB 1048 'Interpretation and Application of Standards', as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities. These financial statements do not conform with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ('IASB').

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Critical accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the incorporated association's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are disclosed in note 2.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the incorporated association and the revenue can be reliably measured. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

Donations

Donations are recognised at the time the pledge is made.

Grants

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Income Tax

As the incorporated association is a charitable institution in terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Trade and Other Receivables

Accounts receivable are recognised initially at the transaction price (i.e. cost) and are subsequently measured at cost less provision for impairment. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of accounts receivable and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognised immediately in the income and expenditure statement.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Plant and equipment is stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant & equipment over the useful life as follows:

Office Equipment	3-5 Years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date. An item of property, plant & equipment is derecognised upon disposal of when there is no future economic benefits to the association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Trade and Other Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the incorporated association prior to the end of the financial year and which are unpaid. Due to their short-term nature they are measured at amortised cost and are not discounted. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included in other receivables or other payables in the Statement of Financial Position. Cash flows are presented on a gross basis.

New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory or early adopted

Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet mandatory, have not been early adopted by the incorporated association for the annual reporting period ended 30 April 2014. The incorporated association has not yet assessed the impact of these new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations.

2 Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

The incorporated association determines the estimated useful lives and related depreciation and amortisation charges for its property, plant and equipment and finite life intangible assets. The useful lives could change significantly as a result of technical innovations or some other event. The depreciation and amortisation charge will increase where the useful lives are less than previously estimated lives, or technically obsolete or non-strategic assets that have been abandoned or sold will be written off or written down.
